

CUPS Track Competition

Allendale Keeps Title

ROCHESTER — Allendale School successfully defended its Conference of Upstate Private Schools' track championship Saturday in a five-team meet in which four records fell.
 Allendale totaled 189½ points to 130 for Park School of Buffalo. Harley School was third with 80 points, Lakemont with 41½ points and Pebble Hill last with 11 points.

Gary Mols of Park took three firsts, and set a conference mark in one event. His effort of 41:41½ in the triple jump bettered his previous conference record of 39-7.

Mols also won the 100-yard hurdles and the 440-yard dash. Dave Present of the Allendale set a new mark in the 100 with :10.1 clocking. The previous record of :10.2 was set in 1950 by

Pete Dow of Park. Ric Bilheimer of Allendale was timed in :22.5 in the 220-yard dash, the first time the event had been run on a straight stretch in conference competition. Ed Bhumichitra of Lakemont re-wrote the broad jump record with a leap of 20-6½.

The Amherst Alumni Trophy went to Allendale on the basis of its accumulated scoring in the senior and junior divisions of the meet.

Park won the midget meet with 60½ points and Harley captured the honors in the cubs category.

PARK IS SECOND IN LEAGUE MEET; MOLS SETS MARK

ROCHESTER, May 25—Park School of Buffalo scored 130 points here Saturday but finished second to defending champion Allendale in the Conference of Upstate Private School's Track Championships. Allendale scored 189½.

Gary Mols of Park broke his own CUPS triple-jump record with a running hop, step and jump of 41 feet, 11½ inches. Mols also won the 100-yard low hurdles in 12.4 seconds and the 4:40 in :55.3.

Park's other winners were Paul Wischerath with a discus throw of 132-10 and the 880-rally of Wischerath, Gerry Lang, Pete Lechner and Mols. Lechner also took the high jump at 5-7.

Park won the Midget Class team title with 60½ points but was runner-up in the Cubs' meet with 23 points to 27 by Harley of Rochester.

In the Senior meet, Allendale's Dave Present set a 100-yard dash CUPS' mark of :10.1, breaking the 1950 record of :10.2 by Park's Pete Dow. Lakemont's Ed Bhumichitra set a running broad-jump record of 20-6½.

Harley was third in senior scoring with 80 points, Lakemont had 41½ and Pebble Hill of Syracuse 11.

Mols, Nitterauer Repeaters on CUPS All-Star Baseball

ROCHESTER, May 26—Gary Mols and Ted Nitterauer of the Park School of Buffalo today were named as repeaters on the Conference of Upstate Private Schools' All-Star baseball team.

Mols, a catcher, and Nitterauer, a pitcher and center-fielder, were named co-captains by CUPS' Chairman Gordon Smith of Allendale School here. The other repeater was Allendale's pitcher and third-base-man.

Champion Pebble-Hill of Syracuse, with a won-7, lost-1 record to 6-2 by runner-up Park, placed second-base-man Frank Nett, third-base-man Dusty Heer, and outfielder and second-base-man Art Putnam on the team. Nett and Heer also pitch.

Allendale also placed catcher-pitcher Bill Simpson on the team. Harley of Rochester had outfielder-pitcher Charles Lotspelch while Lakemont had shortstop-pitcher Bobby Reynolds.

Park players earning honorable mention included: Jim Derrick, first base; Gerry Lang, pitcher-outfielder; John Carroll, left field; and Paul Wischerath, third base.

Nitterauer, still wearing a cast on his right leg today — broken in the fifth game — took the batting title at .565. Mols was third with .423.

Chairman Smith also announced the CUPS All-Star tennis team of first singles Dave Tuthill (7-1) and first doubles Keely Costello and Mike Todd, (five wins and a tie). All are of champion Harley, with a 7-1 record to 6-2 by runner-up Park. Singles runner-up Carl Weissgerber of Park with a 5-3 mark.

Mann, Jefferson Are Winners of Decathlon Titles

Bert Mann, a State University College at Brockport graduate from Rochester, and Jesse Jefferson of Niagara Falls were the decathlon winners Sunday in competition at Williamsville High School.

Mann retained his Niagara District AAU title, winning four events in two days and placing well in six others for 5113 points. Runner-up with 4945 points was Ron Reiber of the University of Buffalo.

Jefferson, representing the Duffy Rapideers of Niagara Falls took the decathlon crown among Olympic Development Meet competitors. He totaled 3645 points.

Three fouls Sunday in the javelin toss held Art Gerbec of the Tonawanda Eldridge Club to 3635 points while Gary Mols of the Park Pioneers was third with 3625.
