

Park Cindermen Lose In Detroit

The Park School track team opened its season, along with 14 other schools from Wisconsin, Illinois, Indiana, Ohio and New York, by participating in the Detroit Country Day School's first annual invitation meet for independent schools on April 24. All of the teams were guests of the school Friday and Saturday under the arrangements of the Athletic Director, John Hannett, former Williamsville athlete.

Allendale School of Rochester emerged victorious with 33 points in a tussle which went to the final relay heat. Hawken School of Cleveland had 30 1/2, Milwaukee University School tied with Cincinnati Country Day School with 21 1/2 points with the host school 5th with 15 1/2 points. Park School garnered 4 points for 12th place as Joe Allen gained a third place in the 880 and Steve Koren a fifth place in the pole vault.

The meet was inaugurated to celebrate Detroit School's 50th anniversary and was run on their new all-weather track. Despite the cold weather which prevailed, an 11' vault was recorded along with :52.5 in the 440, 2:00.1 in the half mile, :16.2 in the high hurdles and :23.7 in the low hurdles and 3:44 in the mile relay and 5' 8" in the high jump.
