 Jerry Robinson figured in two of Park's TDs, hurling an 18-yard pass to Bill Walker and returning a punt 52 yards for the Snyder team's first quarter six-pointers.
 Jim Tedesco ran eight yards for a last-quarter TD.
 Bob Forbush hurred two TD aeriels and Tom Coleman and Rich Flood each scored two TDs to pace Lakemont's free-wheeling offense. Park's football record is 0-2 in CUPS play, 0-3 over-all.
