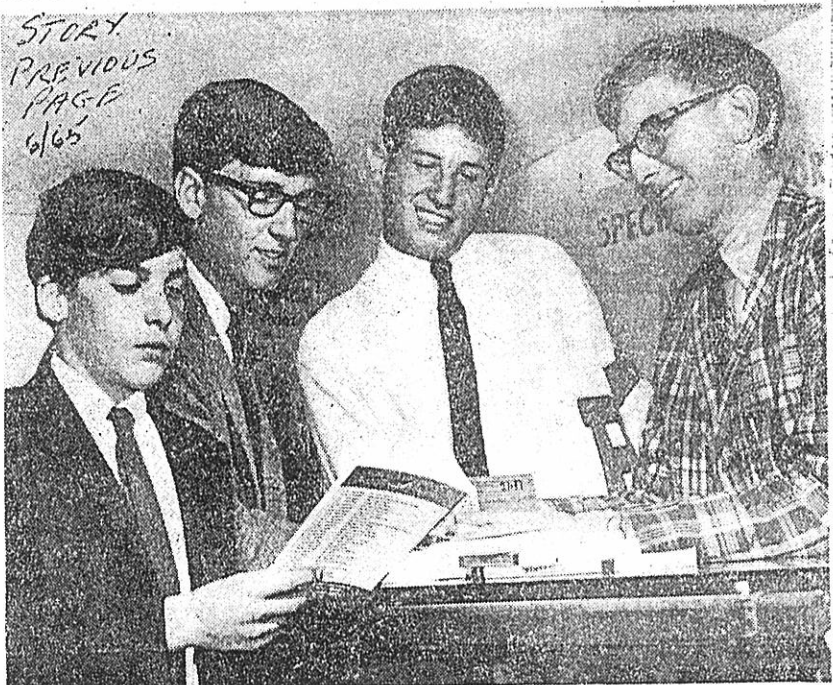

Limestone Hands Park School 5th Straight Defeat

LIMESTONE — Park School's winless six-man football team suffered its fifth straight loss Friday, dropping a 19-12 decision to Limestone High.
Park's Bill Walker got his team on the scoreboard first with a four-yard scoring run in the opening period, but Limestone tied it on a 17-yard pass from Frank Harrington to Tom Conrad.
Limestone went ahead to stay in the second period when Mike Barille passed 31 yards for a touchdown to Harrington and the same combination added the point after.
Both teams scored in the final quarter.

Forbush passed 15 yards to Jack Ortenau for Lakemont's first touchdown and later scored the other two TDs on two and one-yard runs. He also passed for both conversions.

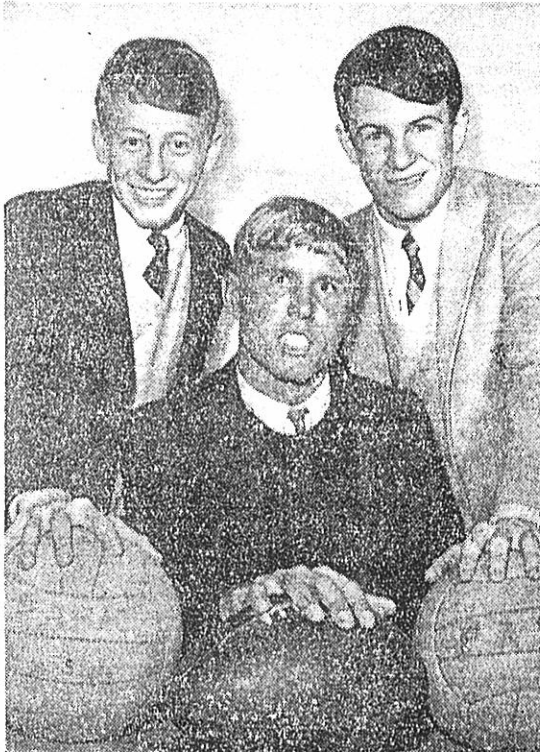
Park Five Beats DeVeaux, 45-40
