ROCHESTER—The Park School finished third in the 20th annual Conference of Upstate Private Schools track meet at Harley School Saturday.

Allendale of Rochester won the Colgate Alumni Trophy for the third consecutive year by amassing 162 points. Runner-up honors went to Lakemont with 113 points, while Park scored 85, Pebble Hill of Syracuse 59 and Harley 36.

Bill Walker sparked the Park lineups by winning the mile run in the senior division in 4:38.1, a meet and school record.

In the junior group Park was led by Jim Morrison and Cort Cary. Morrison won the broad jump and triple jump, while Cary doubled in the shot put and discuss.

The meet was divided into four separate age groups—Cub, Middle, Junior and Senior—with the combined junior and senior scores determining the Colgate Alumni Trophy winner.
