Park Linksman Defeat Allendale

GENEVA—Park School of Buffalo, led by Jerry Robinson, scored a 346-374 victory over Allendale of Rochester at the Geneva Country Club Tuesday to win its fourth straight golf championship in the Conference of Upstate Private Schools.

The CUPS final traditionally opens Park's fall sports program. Robinson fired 37-37-74, or two-over-par, to earn medalist honors and help Park claim the Cort Cary Memorial Trophy for the fourth consecutive year.
