

## Park Club Bows To Pebble Hill

Jim Campbell sank a free throw with 15 seconds remaining to provide visiting Pebble Hill of Syracuse with a 69-68 victory over Park School Friday in a Conference of Upstate Private School basketball teams.

Pebble Hill trailed 25-20 at the end of the first quarter and 33-32 at halftime, but took the lead in

the third period and was in front 56-50 starting the final eight minutes.

Urb Doehner's 23 points paced Pebble Hill, now 2-10 and 2-4 in CUPS play. Jim Morrison and Joe Allen scored 27 and 21 points, respectively, for Park, now 5-10 and 1-6 in the conference.

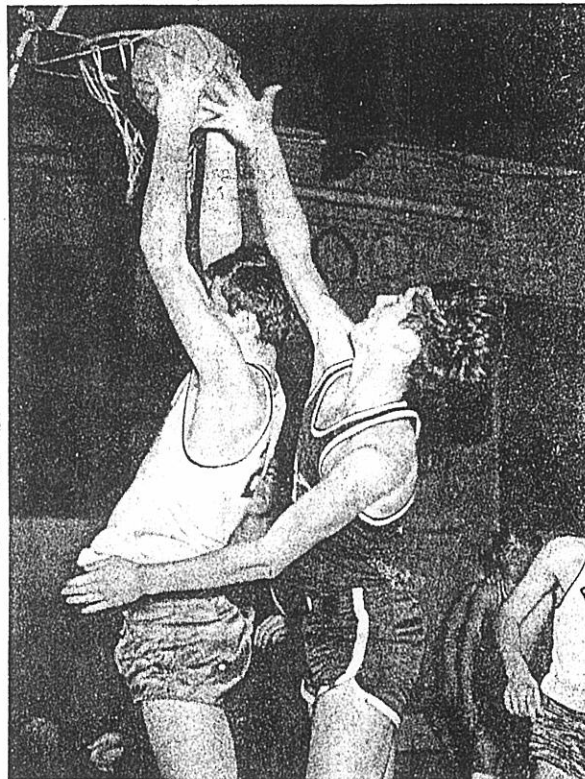
PARK 64 -- CAMPUS 58

## Morrison Nets 27 But Park is Tripped By Pebble Hill, 69-68

Harassed by a full-court press, Park School was edged by visiting Pebble Hill School 69-68 in a CUPS league game. Pebble Hill was outplayed in the first half, but they had a strong third quarter and they maintained their lead despite a last-minute Park rally. The victors were led by Urb Doehner who scored 23 points and by Pete Sherry who netted 13; Steve Draper and Myron Ransom shared 20 points evenly! Jim Morrison and Joe Allen tallied 27 and 21 for Park, while Richie Ehrenreich contributed his 10 points to the Park effort. Park is now 5-10 overall and 1-6 in CUPS league play, while Pebble Hill is 2-10 overall and 2-4 in CUPS competition.

ALLENDALE NIPS PARK  
In a game marked by horrid shooting, Allendale of Rochester edged visiting Park School in a CUPS league game 31-30. The victors made only eleven out of fifty shots for just 22%, while

Park was 12 for 65 for a meager 18%. The game seesawed between Park and Allendale until Ed Perego converted on a three-point play with five minutes of play remaining to put Allendale in front for good. Perego led the Rochester team with ten points. Joe Allen was Park's high scorer with six. The game was Allendale's third CUPS victory in eight games. Park ended its season with a 5-11 record in overall play. The Pioneers maintained a 1-7 record in CUPS competition, its poorest record in 21 years in CUPS play!

The 1966-67 Bee All-Area Basketball team is composed of two players from Sweet Home, Ron Wehrich and Dave DeLuca, along with Gary Beebe of Amherst, Keith DiPirro of Williamsville and Jim Morrison from Park School. Sweet Home is the only

team in the area, a 4th place finisher in Division II of the E.C.L.C. that had a winning record, 11 wins and 7 defeats. Also this is the first year that a local team hasn't been represented in the post-season playoffs in some time.

**WEHRICH TOP SCORER**  
Wehrich led the Panthers in scoring with 285 for a 15.8 average and also was the area's leading point producer. In his three years of varsity ball he totaled 582 points breaking the old mark of 514 set by Denny Meyer in 1962-63. He also set an individual scoring record of 35 points to eclipse Ed Smith's total two years ago. Ron's third record breaking feat was season total. He broke last year's record of 264 set by teammate Dave DeLuca. Ron shot 34% from the field, 102 of 269 and 60% from the foul line, 81 of 135. He led the Club in rebounds with 118 and 62 steals. Ron led Division II in scoring with a 16.5 average.

Teammate Dave DeLuca finished third in the area in scoring with 208, a 14.8 average.

Dave's two-year total was 472 third highest in the school's history. He stole the ball 23 times from the opposition and brought down 63 rebounds. In the shooting department he shot 35% from the field, 83 of 234. At the foul line he made 42 of 64 for 65%. The services of these two players will be sorely missed by Coach Dick McLaughlin next season.
