

What kind of a spring have we had? On Tuesday, May 16, Park dropped Harley of Rochester 6-3 to up its baseball record to .5 and 2. It was the 4th home game and the 4th time on the field. What with the vagaries of the weather, any time the field was partially presentable to play, a game was scheduled. The regular schedule went by the boards the first week. Rich Appel pitched a steady game for his third win and a 4 run first inning was sufficient for the offense. Senior co-captains Ed Michaels and Read Boeckel each contributed two hits with Michaels' double plating two in the 7th.

The tennis team gained its second win over Harley 4-1. Number one and All-CUPS singles star, Dave Tuthill of the visitors continued undefeated for three years but was pressed by Mike Koren 108, 6-4. Park then took over with Joe Clark and Doug Kelly prevailing in singles and the tandems of Rich Horowitz and Rich Ehrenreich and Tom Speller with Mike Lewin scoring doubles victories.

The track team gained a triangular win with 81 points to DeVeaux School of Niagara Falls with 60 and Campus School of Buffalo with 18 points. The skies were clear but the track was still not dried out. First places in 10 of the 15 events provided Park with its margin. Jim Morrison garnered doubles in the long and triple jump along with a leg of the relay. Jim Tedesco started off with a win in the 100 low hurdles, Gary Sidell added the 220, and the meet was clinched with Joe Allen's 880 win, Bill Walker triumphing in the mile and Soph A. J. Block picking up the two mile in his first attempt at the distance. Cort Cary had his best, 42' 1/2" to cop the shot, and the Vogel brothers tied for the pole vault win. This meet was the final tuneup for the CUPS championships which return to Park for the first time in 4 years, Sat., May 27. The schools compete in 4 age-group divisions with the Seniors and Juniors combining for the Colgate trophy.

Park's last season game against Allendale in Rochester was the Pioneer's third CUPS loss. Bowing to the 12-4 score were Park pitchers Bob Rupp and Bob Brown (5th). The Allendale team was really clicking! Skip Burnham and Mike Goldman both had home runs for Allendale, Burnham scoring 3 RBI's and Goldman 2. Park's only big hitter was Paul Farber, whose 3rd inning triple sent in one Park run.

The Park tennis team was again victorious over Allendale, beating them 5-0. Park's netmen have achieved a 7-1 league record, and have clinched a tie for the CUPS league championship!

Park now ends the Spring season with an overall 7-4 record in tennis and 5-5 in baseball.

# Park Trackmen Score Clean Sweep In Meet

The 21st annual Conference of Upstate Private Schools track meet, resulted in an unprecedented clean sweep of all age-groups for Park School. For the first time in league history a school accomplished this feat. It returned the Colgate trophy to Snyder for the first time since 1956 and interrupted an 8-year reign of Allendale of Rochester.

The combined seniors and juniors total gave Park 195 points to Allendale's 152, Lakemont's 56 with Harley and Pebble Hill tying at 20. In the Midget class, Park eked out Harley 55-53 with the deciding relay victory, Pebble Hill had 13 and Allendale 11. In the CUBS division, Park led with 22 points, Allendale next with 14, Harley 10 and Pebble Hill 8.

In the older divisions Park camp up with 11 individual wins of the 24 events. Only Jim Morrison came through with a double win to demonstrate the depth of the Pioneers, 12 seniors and 14 juniors contributing points. Phil Hurdle of Allendale turned in the top individual effort with record-breaking wins in the junior triple jump, long jump, half mile and relay. George Amarandos of Allendale swept the 100, 220 and third in the high jump and anchor on the relay to be top point man in the seniors. But their efforts were too little to match the overall depth of Park. Jim Tedesco and Kerry Madden set 120 low hurdles marks in the senior and junior classes. Cort Cary and Bill Derrick swept first two places in the shot and discus. Bill Walker fell short of his school record but established a Park track record in the mile and Joe Allen

missed by .3 second of the same. Dick Appel's 440, Don Vogel's pole vault, and Mike Brock's shot completed Junior first place efforts.

The meet lead changed hands several times. First Park, then Allendale, who opened up a 17 point bulge at the noon break. However, 2 events later, Park swept all 5 places in the Junior shot, and started a streak of 7 straight first places which put the meet out of Allendale's reach.

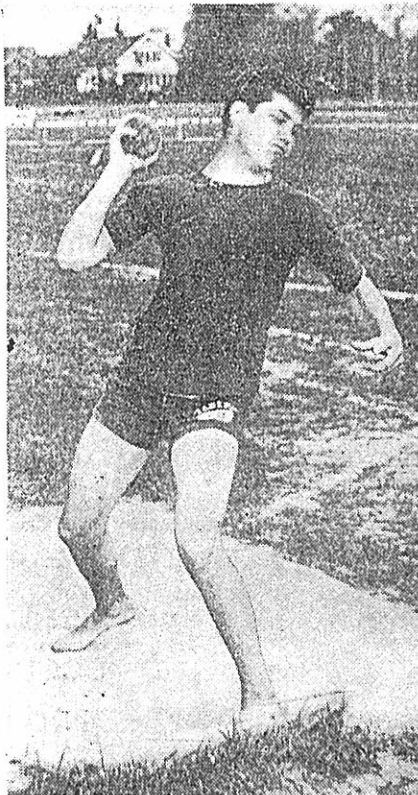

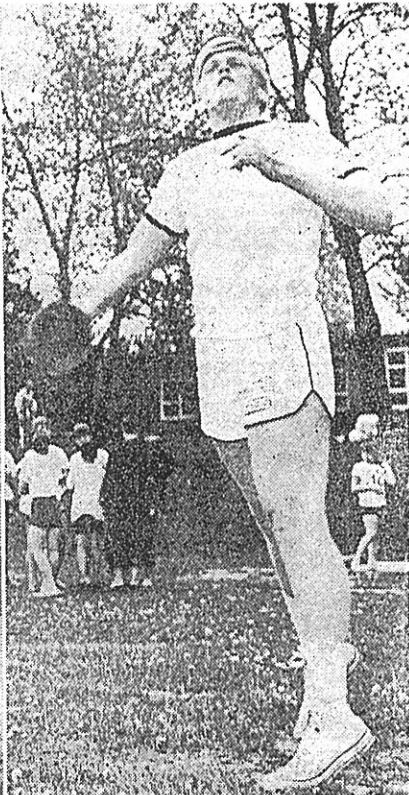
