Limestone Blanks Park Six, 35-0

The Park School of Buffalo opened its '67 football season with an excursion to Cattaraugus County, conceding a 35-0 victory to Limestone. The purposeful and united efforts of the Limestone team were amply reflected by Jerry Harrington, who completed 10 out of 16 passes, including touchdown passes to Steve Saunders and Ralph Battone. (Not to mention the running of Ken Hatch, who went 26 and 12 yards for two scores, highlighting the Limestone offense. Harrington drop kicked two P.A.T.'s and completed a pass for a third and successful P.A.T. Bob Whiteman completed the scoring in undermining Park's best drive with an interception and a 72 yard marathon.

John Sheedy and Paul Farber led the Park running attack with 50 and 56 yards respectively on 12 carries each. The passing attack proved fruitless.

Pebble Hill Tops Park School, 12-6

Last Friday, the Park School of Buffalo opened the CUPS football season with Pebble Hill, defending champion of the Conference of Upstate Private Schools (CUPS), at Syracuse. Park conceded a 12-6 victory to Pebble Hill.

Pebble Hill, although not inordinately vigorous, displayed a great deal of organization and team coordination. In the second quarter, Pete Sherry of the grid-ders scored the first touch down on a 6 yd. run. Park's John Sheedy scored a touch down on a 45 yd. pass to Richard Appel, evening up the score in the third quarter. Subsequently, Pete Sherry made his second touch down on a 25 yd. run, highlighting the game--adversely for some. In the last, dying moments of the game, the booters covered some 45 yds. in an unfruitful attempt to counter-score and reassert themselves. From a statistician's point of view, Park played not only the worse game, but the better.

Simultaneously, Park's varsity soccer team defeated Pebble Hill 5-1. Goals were scored by Rich-

ard Ehrenreich and Bob Rupp of Park in the first quarter. And Rich Davis scored once in the second quarter for Pebble Hill. In the third quarter, goals were achieved by Bob Rupp and Thor Ellestad respectively, and by Don Vogel in the fourth.

On Tuesday, Sept. 19, Park's varsity and j.v. soccer teams opened their season with Neumann, at Neumann. In both games, Park came forth in the darkness of defeat. In the varsity game, Chuck McKay and Chuck Hanny, scored in the second and third quarters respectively. While Park's own Don Vogel scored in the fourth, resulting in a 2-1 victory for Neumann. In the j.v. game, Kent Jewett of Park made one goal, and Hoffman, an opponent, scored a second. In the third quarter, Hoffman and Tottenham made two goals for Neumann. In the fourth quarter, Jewett, determined to rescue Park from defeat, scored the final goal. Nevertheless, Neumann won 3-2.

Park School Scores Sweep In CUPS Track Competition

Host Park School captured the Conference of Upstate Private Schools (CUPS) track championship Saturday, ending the 8-year reign of Rochester's Allendale School.

Park, coached by Jim Schum, scored an unprecedented sweep of four classes to win the Colgate Trophy for the first time since 1958. Park totaled 198 points, second place Allendale, 152.

Seven meet records fell and one track mark was bettered.

Allendale's Phil Hurdle set three meet marks and ran a leg on the record-setting 880 relay team. Competing in the junior class, Hurdle took the 880, triple jump and long jump.

Park's Jerry Madden and Jim Tedesco set meet standards in the junior and senior low hurdles, respectively. Madden won in :16.2, and Tedesco in :15.1. Bill Walker of Park set a meet record with a 4:46.3 clocking in the senior mile. Lakemont's Brian

Thomas bettered the senior pole vault mark, topping 11-1/2.

In the Midgets, the scores were: Park 53, Harley 53, Pebble Hill 13, Allendale 11. In the Cubs, Park scored 22, Allendale 14, Harley 10, and Pebble Hill 8.
