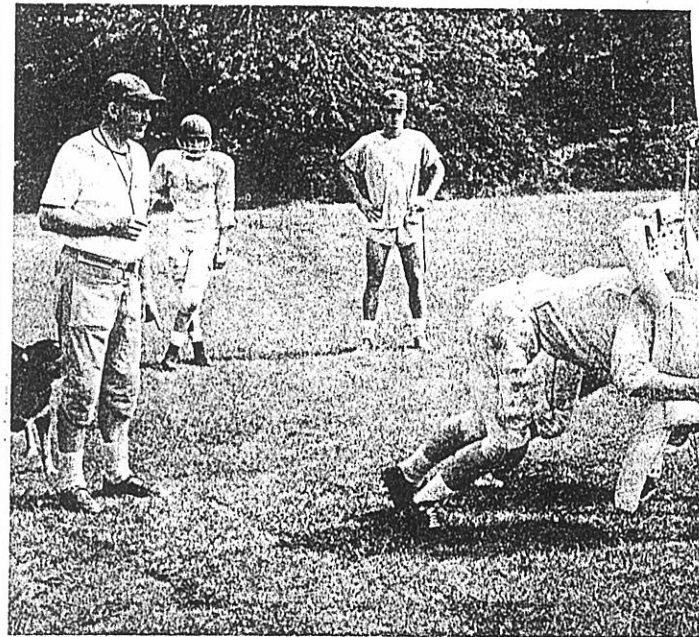


Park 'Six' Opens Football Season Saturday At Limest

GRIDDERS LOSE, BOOTERS WIN FOR PARK SCHOOL

 SYRACUSE, Sept. 23 — Buffalo's Park School won at soccer, and lost at football in Conference of Upstate Private School League matches against Pebble Hill here Friday.

Park's soccer team scored a 5-1 victory as Bill Rupp tallied two goals and Rich Ehrenreich, Thor Ellestad and Don Vogel counted one each.

Pebble Hill's six-man football team beat Park, 12-6. Pete Sherry scored twice for the winners on a 6-yard run and a 25-yard runback of an intercepted pass. John Sheedy passed 45 yards to Rich Appel for Park's TD.

Park Upends Lakemont 40-6 For First Victory

Friday, The Park School of Buffalo defeated Lakemont of Watkins Glen, at Park, 40-6, in the second CUPS football game. At present, they have 1 victory and 2 defeats.

The spectacular performance of Park's John Sheedy manifested the resolute struggles of his fellows for unity. He made his first touchdown in the first period on a 33 yd. pass from Richard Appel and scored two extra pts. on a drop kick. In the second period he made 3 touch downs; one on a 27 yd. run, consummated by a P.A.T. on a pass from Sheedy to David Mols; one on an 8 yd. run; and the third on a pass for 8 yds. from Appel, followed by an extra pt. by Comeau on a pass from Sheedy. Although not considered a 'runner,' Sheedy ran a respectable 81 yds. on twelve carries.

In the last period, Park's Richard Comeau scored a touchdown on a 1 yd. pass from Appel, and the crowning glory was Bill Derrick's touchdown on a pass for 42 yds. from Mols. Paul Wilcox made Lakemont's touchdown on a 5 yd. run.

At the same time, our varsity soccer was busy accomplishing its second CUPS victory of the season over Lakemont. The overall record is 2 wins and 2 defeats.

Don Vogel scored in the second period, surmounting the apparent aura of futility which pervaded throughout the first period. Mike Lewin made a second goal in the third quarter, and Lakemont's

Cornelius Kinney made the last goal of the game.

The varsity and j.v. played Campus, at Campus, resulting in a 2-0 victory for the j.v. and a 2-4 defeat for the varsity, on Monday, the 25th.

In the varsity game, Park's Rick Vogel made a goal in the first quarter, as did Warren Galloway of Campus, who scored again in the second. Park's Thor

Ellestad and Henry Jones of Campus both made one goal in the third. Greg Ruzzive made the final goal in the final quarter.

The only scorers in the j.v. game were Robbie Wilson in the first quarter, and Douglas Mancini in the last -- both of Park. For the j.v., which has an overall record of 1 win and 1 loss, this was the beginning of the CUPS soccer season.
