Tips Pebble Hill

Park wins home opener

Park basketballers opened their home season and the friendly boards made a difference as they defeated Campus School of Buffalo 81-69. Once again they had to come from behind as Campus was torrid from the field in the first quarter taking a 22-18 lead. Park cut the deficit at halftime to 36-34 and midway through the 3rd quarter the rebounding strength of Paul Farber, Duane Sevillian and Rich

Appel came through and a lead of 58-55 was gained at the end of the third quarter. Control of the ball and added scoring came from soph guards Dave Mols and Jeff Rochwarger as the margin increased to the final score. The loss of Farber and Sevillian on fouls in the final period did little to stem the impetus of the Park offense and they managed to control the defensive boards as well. SUMMARY:

The Pioneers came from behind and edged Pebble Hill of Syracuse 65-58. A cold first half for Park found them trailing 34-23. They were out-hustled, out-rebounded and out-shot.

In the third quarter they began to settle down and with Sevillian cashing in offensive rebounds, they moved up to a 4 point deficit at the end of the third. The press continued to

throw Pebble Hill off balance and finally Park moved to a tie and finally a lead midway through the final period.

When Sevillian and Appel fouled out, the guards Mols, Rochwarger and Rupp took up the slack and with Mancini dropping in 3 buckets the lead went up to 10 and the win was sealed in spite of Herb Poole's final 2 baskets. He was high for the visitors with 25 and an excellent day off the boards while Paul Farber finally managed 21 points although his percentage took a huge dip. Sevillian added 11, Appel 9 and Mols and Mancini 8 each.

Park shot only 30% from the field as compared to the Hillers 42%. Park made 15 of 24 from the free throw stripe but Pebble Hill made 16 of 30. Park now is 1 and 1 in CUPS while Pebble Hill dropped to 0 and 3, all on the road. SUMMARY:

Park's late surge against Harley falls short

An aggressive Harley School of Rochester spurted late in the first quarter, and then hung on in the final minutes to gain a CUPS win of 53-48 over Park, whose record now drops to 1 and 2 while Harley moved up to second place with a 2 and 1 record.

The margin was gained from the field where Harley hit 22 of 57 for 40% against Park's 19 of 54 for 34%. Park failed to take advantage of fouls making but 10 of 21 while Harley caged 9 of 13.

Harley jumped to a 17-10 first quarter edge and maintained this thru most of the game, 28-18 at halftime. Park closed at times to 3 and 4 in the final minutes but could not make the pressure stick. Co-captain Rich Appel tossed in 15 to lead Park while Phil Lovell had 18 for Harley, mostly from outside.

In a non-league game, Park was edged by St. Mary's School for the Deaf 72-68. The teams exchanged the first couple baskets and Saint Mary's finally took an edge of 15-12 at the third quarter.

In the second 5'5" Dave Fitzgerald took charge and put the visitors in front at halftime 41-26. Park finally reversed the momentum and brought the margin closer and trailed only by three, 51-48 at the end of the third quarter.

The final canto was tight as each team tied and then took the lead several times, but in the final minutes St. Mary's

breaking the press twice and cashing in a couple free throws which made the final decision secure for his team.

The Park JV lost 33-26. Fitzgerald led the scorers with 31 with Cerniglia with 26. Appel led Park with 18.

Park defeated twice

The Park basketball team visited Nichols last Tuesday and ended up short by a 71-42 score. Out-sized, out-speeded and out-hustled, Park was behind 20-9 at the first quarter and continued to drop further as Nichols controlled both boards and shot an excellent 54% compared to the Pioneers 25% from the field.

Balanced scoring led by Ed Zablocki with 14, Eulis Cathey with 12 and Ted Carl with 10 headed Nichols while only Dick Appel with 15 and Paul Farber with 15 counted for Park. Nichols JV won 42-18.

Park completed its first round in CUPS action with a game at Allendale of Rochester losing 51-45 and logging a record of 1 and 3 while Allendale moved to 2-2.

Rebounding told the story of the close game as Park was unable to penetrate either board consistently. The Snyder team held a 9-8 edge at the end of the first quarter and took its largest margin of the game at 21-16 midway thru the next period only to suffer a drought as Allendale made ten straight points and a 29-28 halftime lead.

Only Dick Appel was caging shots and he was in early foul trouble and sat out half the quarter. Jim Case and Dick Chase returned from the injured lists to score 21 and 16 points respectively for the home team and provide their winning margin.

Both teams shot 30% from the field but Allendale had the 4 shot margin from the foul line which told the story in the final minutes as Appel fouled out of the game. The Park JV lost 33-17.

St. Mary's Beats Park

Sophomore Dave Fitzgerald, a 5-5 free scorer, tallied 31 points and Carl Cerniglia meshed 26 as St. Mary's School for the Deaf registered a 72-68 triumph at Park School Tuesday.

Fitzgerald was high for the game, but went scoreless in the last quarter. Cerniglia picked up the slack, however. He scored two baskets to put St. Mary's up three points and, after Park's Dick Appel cut the gap to one, meshed both ends of a one-and-one situation to lock up the win.

St. Mary's, playing without injured Pat Berrigan, had a 41-26 lead at halftime. Park reared back to tie twice and go ahead before Cerniglia came through. Appel paced Park with 16 points. Duane Sevillian added 14, Dave Mols 13 and Paul Farber 10.

The Saints have a 3-3 record in the Bishop Smith League. Park's over-all mark is 2-5.

Park loses, 61-52

In its sole basketball contest of last week, Park traveled to Campus and were up-ended 61-52. Jan Person with 22 points led the reversal of an earlier contest. Copeland added 14. Campus took the early lead 16-10 at the end of the first quarter. Gradually, with control of the boards the large difference, Park bounced back as Duke Sevillian sank 5 of his 6 baskets to take a halftime lead of 34-27.

With baskets from all five second half starters, Campus played more deliberately and had regained the lead by the end of the quarter 44-42. Forced to play catch-up, Park fouled while Campus moved the ball well against Park's presses and lengthened its margin. Rich Appel was again high for Park with 13, Sevillian had 12 and Dave Mols 9. The Campus Jayvees also won 49-34 with Greg Chavous caging 12 while Larry Davis had 12 for the Pioneers. The Campus varsity shot 43% to Park's 34 and rebounded 41-31.

Park Loses

Pebble Hill of Syracuse played host to Park School last Friday and avenged an earlier defeat by coming from behind in the final quarter 48-44. Park this exchanged places with Pebble Hill in the CUPS league cellar.

Once again co-captain Dick Appel led the Park scorers with 12 but he sat out the second quarter after drawing his third personal and finally fouled out early in the final quarter with Park still leading 38-36. The Syracuse team had a 12-6 margin to the wire and pulled out its second straight league win.

Herb Poole bossed the boards as his team had a 39-29 margin in rebounds and added 11 points as his fellow guards Larry Loeb and Gary Schultz had 15 and 14 respectively. Only Bob Rupp with 10 was in double figures to aid Appel for Park. Park's field percentage was 34% against PH 31 but the latter took more shots. Park had 10 for 14 from the foul line whereas Pebble Hill made only 8 of 24 but the field margin prevailed.

Park's JV team gained its second win 46-19. Next week Park will travel to Campus for its only game.
