

Park wins finale

A come from behind win over Allendale School of Rochester 69-51 retrieved some solace for the Park basketballers. The victory gave them a 2-6 record in the league and dropped Allendale to 2-5, avenging an earlier loss at Allendale. Off to a 6-0 and 13-8 lead in the first quarter, the Park offense stalled and Allendale came out with a 22-21 lead at halftime. In the third quarter Park switched to a 1-3-1 defense which caused numerous turnovers and a balanced scoring attack moved the Pioneers into a 42-36 margin at the end of the third quarter. In the last quarter Park's fast break off a trap press went into high gear and sparked by Co-captains Dick Appel and Bob Rupp the final score went to 69-51. Paul Farber and Dick Lipsitz join the co-captains in the last game for Park. Duane Sevillian cashed key baskets and Dave Mols led in assists. Sevillian and Farber led the rebounders as Park grabbed 32 to the visitors 22. Park managed a 39% field percentage against 36 for Allendale who was again led by Jim Case's 22 points. Rich Appel was high for the game with 25 points as he totalled 179 points for 13 games. In the JV contest Larry Davis' jumper from inside the foul line with 5 seconds remaining won the contest 34-32 after Park had been down at halftime 22-12. Paul Lenzner with 12 and Davis with 11 paced the scoring.



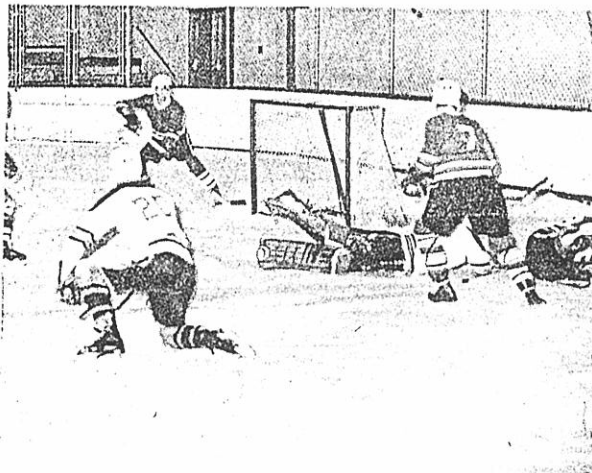
RICH APPEL...pitches win over Allendale

Park closes season against Allendale

returned and was quickly wiped out in the third with his low of 5 points for the year.

Park played host to DeVeaux School of Niagara Falls on Friday and lost a heart-breaker 61-60 in overtime. The Cataract team's balanced attack prevailed in the first half as all five scored, led by Al Burton's drives and Scott Skinner's jumps from outside. However the Pioneers never led down and gradually they overcame spotty shooting with better disciplined ballhandling and shooting along with some determined rebounding. Down by 12 points at one time they bounced back to a 29-25 halftime deficit.

The usual inability to cope with Rochester officiating spelled doom by the third quarter and Harley breezed to its win. They were led by Rick Perry's 21 points aided by Phil Lovell and John Vaughan's 10 and 11 each. Paul Farber regained some of his rebounding touch and was high with 12 points followed by Duane Sevillian with 8 and Dave Mols with 6. Harley had a 35-29 edge in rebounds, outscored Park from the field with a 31-28% but the real margin came at the foul line where they made 17 of 36 while Park managed only 9 of 16.

In the overtime period it was Burton on 2 drives and Bob Rupp twice tying for Park. Skinner then drove for the final bucket, missed his foul but Park was unable to drop the needed bucket in the final seconds.

DeVeaux thus won its first basketball championship since 1956 and second in league history with a 7-1 record, edging defending champion Harley who ended up with a 6-2 record. DeVeaux will receive the Cornell Club of Buffalo trophy in March. Park completes its season next Friday against Allendale.
