

Park defeats Harley in baseball opener

The finest spring in decades allowed Park School to visit Harley School of Rochester and eke out a 10-8 decision in an 8 inning extra-inning game. Dick Appel opened the 8th with a walk, stole 2nd and 3rd and scored on an infield out in a close play at home. Dick Comeau got a life on a centerfield error and scored on a single off the bat of Dick Lipsitz to provide icing. Bob Rupp, who relieved Appel in the 7th, struck out two and got the final out on a pop-up to left. Park outhit Harley 12 to 8 with each starter getting at least one hit with Paul Farber, Lipsitz and Will Karrer each getting two. Appel drove in 2 in the first with a homer. Opening game jitters allowed Harley to take advantage of several fielding errors and to take a 5-4 lead in the 4th and an 8-7 lead in the 6th but Park tied in the 7th and won out in the 8th.

A perfect game - 15 batters up, 15 down - pitching performance by Richard Appel Friday helped the Park School of Buffalo clinch at least a tie for the baseball championship of the Conference of Upstate Private Schools.

Appel struck out 13 Pebble Hill batters en route of a 2-0 victory in the first game of a doubleheader Friday at Park School. Not a runner reached first base in the seven-inning game.

Meanwhile, the Park tennis team clinched the CUPS championship with 5-0 and 4-1 victories over Pebble Hill. The defeat of Park's second doubles team in the final match was the local school's only loss in eight starts this season.

Fred Keller, Mike Koren and Tom Speller were unbeaten in singles and Dick Ehrenreich and Doug Kelly in first doubles. Mark Lewin and Joe Clark won every match except one.

Appel, co-captain of Park's football and basketball teams and president of the Student Government, also started Friday's second game of the baseball twin bill, but his fast ball had lost some of its zip.

Bob Rupp took over and hurled Park to a 10-5 victory as his teammates rallied with a six-run sixth inning. Rupp and Dave Mols each batted in two runs during the rally and Steve

The track team opened its season at the Nichols Invitation finishing 4th with 19 points behind Nichols with 55. Allendale with 45, DeVeaux with 44. Jim Morrison was one of two double event winners as he won the triple jump with a 39-ft., 11-in. leap and the long jump with his career 'best' of 20-ft., 1/2-in. Bill Derrick took a second in the discus, Bruce Young a third in the triple jump, Don Vogel a 4th in the pole vault and the 880 relay team came in third while the mile relay team took fourth.

This week the spiked shoes traveled to Rochester and engaged Allendale, Pebble Hill at Harley in an early preview of the CUPS meet, to be held at Park May 25th. Noticeable improvement was shown by the Pioneers as they were edged by Allendale 62 1/2 to 61 1/2 with Pebble Hill trailing with 20 and Harley with 9.

Kerry Madden tied for first in the 120 low hurdles, Don Vogel took the pole vault with a 9-ft. vault, Bill Derrick doubled with the shot at 41-ft., 7/4-in. and the

discus at 126-ft., 8-in. and Jim Morrison improved his long jump mark with a 20-ft., 1/4-in. leap. Morrison also took a second in the triple jump, Cort Cary had a second and third in the weights. Madden took second in the vault. Rick Vogel had a second in the 880 and 4th in vault, while Pete Simmons took runner-up in the sprints. Other points were added by John Sheedy's 3rd in the 880 and A.J. Block third in the mile and Bob Suwinski had thirds in the high and long jump, Bruce Young a third in the triple and Rick Francisco a 4th in the shot. Park's relay team finished second in the 880.
