

TENNIS RETIRES CUPS TROPHY

The tennis team completed its season undefeated, first time since 1962 that the champions went unscathed; in fact the past three years have seen only ties for the title. At Allendale, the racketeers gained their 6th straight shutout as follows:

- The season finale saw Park take a doubleheader win over previously tied Pebble Hill of Syracuse thereby making its record 8 and 0, with the only loss of a match occurring in 2nd doubles of the final match. The scores were 5-0 and 4-1. Fred Keller, Mike Koren and Tom Speller were undefeated in singles play along with Rich Ehrenreich & Doug Kelly in doubles play.

Park nine clinches CUPS tie, tennis finishes unbeaten.

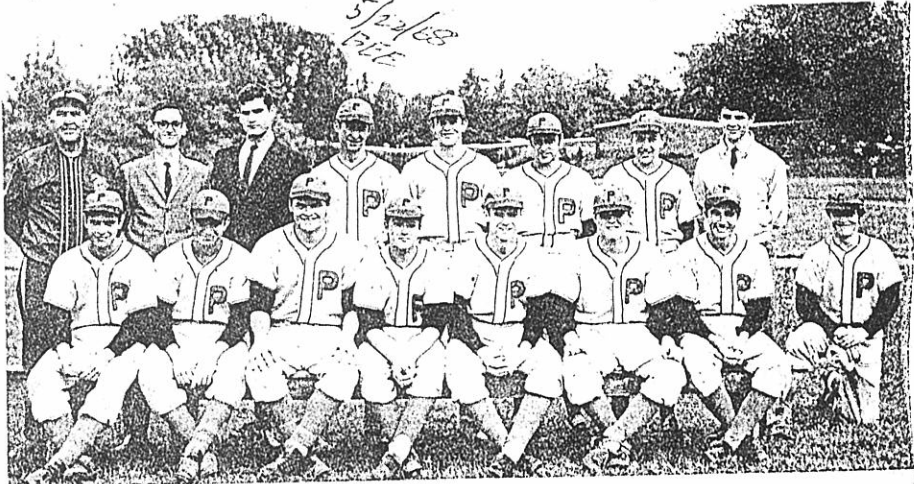
Park completed the baseball season with three wins to make its record 6 and 2 thereby clinching a tie for the Dartmouth Cup. Harley and Lakemont also have only two losses but face each other as well as another game to go. On Tuesday the Pioneers visited Allendale of Rochester and triumphed 11-2 in what was their best showing of the season. Rich Appel went the route for his 3rd straight win, striking out 12 and allowing but 3 hits. Appel, Rupp and Paul Farber had two hits apiece while Rupp and Dave Mols drove in 2 each. Mark Cox and Willie Karrer had doubles with Capt. Steve Caprow clouting a triple.

In the season's finale, Park took both ends of a doubleheader with Pebble Hill School of Syracuse. In the opener, Rich Appel pitched a perfect game for the 5 inning contest, 15 batters, with 13 strikeouts, a grounder back to the mound and a short fly ball to left being the only playable hits which were easy outs. This was first in Park annals. In addition, Bob Rupp, leadoff man got to first on a walk, went to second on Appel's perfect bunt, and both players eventually scored on a passed ball and a ground out by Steve Caprow. This proved to be the only scoring for either team. The Snyder school took the second contest 10-5, but it was an uphill struggle. Appel continued on the mound and while he garnered 4 more strikeouts, which breaks the old CUPS record of 66, he was victim of a couple scratch hits, errors and 4 runs were in when he was replaced by Bob Rupp, who cooled off the Syracuse effort with 4 hits and 1 run and added 6 more strikeouts. In the seventh, he lost his control and Dick Lavery came in to strike out the final batter leaving the bases stranded. It wasn't until the 6th inning that Park came up with a 6 run inning to clinch the contest, Rupp and Dave Mols each singling for 2 RBIs. Caprow drove in 2 earlier with a single and bases loaded walk. Appel's double was the sole extra baser.

Park School played host to winner DeVeaux School of Niagara Falls (64 points) and St. Marys School for the Deaf (59) ending with 38 points. At the conclusion of the meet it appeared that DeVeaux and St. Marys had tied but the pole vault was still underway with 4 having cleared 10'. The sole DeVeaux vaulter, Tom Macauly emerged the winner on least attempts with three Park vaulters finishing up in the other spots, and thereby gaining the win for DeVeaux. Park had a double winner in Jim Morrison who took the long and triple jump as he set a track record in the latter with 40' 8". Carl Cerniglia of St. Marys took his

specialties, the 100 and 220 and anchored the victorious 880 relay team. Chuck Fusco also doubled for the St. Marys team in the shot and discus. 2 other track records were set by St. Marys' Bob Aldi in the 2 mile with a time of 11:10.6 while the DeVeaux quartet of Weil Kelsey, Butler and Carpenter set a mile record of 3:51.0.
