Park retains championship

On Saturday, the 22nd Annual Conference of Upstate Private Schools Track meets were held at the Snyder campus and Park retained its championship in the combined Senior & Junior Divisions, scoring a record 213 points, Allendale had 104, Harley 78, Lakemont 41 and Pebble Hill 36. In the Midget (under 14) and CUBS (under 12) Park relinquished the titles which they had won last year, in both cases Harley of Rochester gained the championships.

Pete Simmons and Jim Morrison were double winners as well as running on the winning relay team. Morrison set a school and track record in the long jump while A. J. Block and Don Vogel set 2 of the 4 CUPS Junior records, the only records to be broken in the 37 event program.

ALL-CUPS awards were announced by Herbert J. Mols, Athletic Director at Park, after

the annual spring Directors' meeting held in conjunction with the CUPS Track championships.

Repeating for the Snyder nine were Richard Appel and Paul Farber while third baseman and sole Senior on this year's team, Steve Caprow, also made the select team. Honorable Mention was accorded catcher Richard Comeau, pitcher-outfielder Bob Rupp and shortstop Dave Mols. Appel and Caprow were co-captains of the 1968 squad while Appel and Rupp have been elected co-captains for 1969.

In tennis, the format for ALL-CUPS was changed so that each position will be named according to their records. Accordingly, 1st singles is Fred Keller, Park with 8-0 record; 2nd Singles, Mike Koren, Park, 7-0; 3rd Singles, Tom Speller, Park, 5-0; 1st Doubles, Rich Ehrenreich & Doug Kelly, Park, 4-0; and 2nd Doubles, Dave Klimczak and Dave Capps, Pebble Hill, 6-0 record.

Park School, which had won the Conference of Upstate Private Schools tennis title and tied for the baseball championship, ended a successful spring season Saturday by taking the conference track crown on its field. Park had 213 1/2 points in combined senior and junior scoring. Allendale had 104, Harley 78, Lakemont 41 and Pebble Hill 38. Jim Morrison of Park won two events, ran on a winning

relay team and set a school and track record in the long jump. Pete Simmons also won twice and was on a victorious relay team. A. J. Block and Don Vogel of Park set CUPS junior records, as did Bill Hurdle of Allendale and an Allendale relay team. LAKEMONT—Park School won a track meet and two tennis matches but dropped a baseball doubleheader to Lakemont Academy Friday at the Lakemont athletic fields. The track team won easily, 95-30, in its first dual meet of the season and the Park netmen blanked the hosts twice in tennis. The twin tennis triumph continued Park's undefeated status in the Conference of Upstate Private Schools (CUPS) with Pebble Hill. The team is 5-0 for the year. The baseballers lost their first two of the campaign, being edged 4-3 in the opener and downed 8-4 in the second. Park now has a 3-2 mark while Lakemont is 4-1 and in CUPS first place. Rich Appel turned in a 15-strike-out performance for Park in the second game after Lakemont had opened with a five-run first inning.
