In the CUPS opener at DeVeaux on Friday, Park rallied to come close but not close enough as they lost 58-54. It was DeVeaux's first win since rejoining the league this year. An ankel injury to Dick Ehrenreich in the first 20 seconds forced some revision of team organization while DeVeaux was hot from the field taking a 16-8 lead.
