In the consolation game, Akron romped past Park School, 68-28. Al Corbett was high for the winners with 30 points, followed by Joe Keller with 19 and Chet Victor's 11.

The host school got a 22-point performance from Mike Schebell in downing Park School, 62-30, and Grand Island overpowered Akron, 77-60, with Doug Townson's 21 leading the way.

The triumph for Gibbons was its first in six starts and spoiled Park's 1968-69 inaugural. Grand Island now has a 3-2 record while Akron is 1-3.

Park will play Akron in tonight's first game at 6:30, while the title match is set for 8.

DeVeaux Cagers Trip Park, 58-54

Park cagers drop two

In the CUPS opener at DeVeaux on Friday, Park rallied to come close but not close enough as they lost 58-54. It was DeVeaux's first win since rejoining the league this year. An ankle injury to Dick Ehrenreich in the first 20 seconds forced some revision of team organization while DeVeaux was hot from the field taking a 16-8 lead.

The Pioneers battled back and were down 27-24 at the half with some balanced scoring. Another letdown in the third quarter saw DeVeaux forge to a 45-34 lead at the end of the quarter and with the first couple buckets of the 4th, the Raiders had a 13 point lead.

Park then began its comeback and came within 2 points. A couple lapses, upon which DeVeaux capitalized, put them ahead by six with 2 minutes left, but again foul shots by Mols, Appel and Rochwarger reduced the margin to 3. Scott Skinner's basket offset a rebound by Paul Farber and Skinner's foul shot with 5 seconds left, iced the win.

The JV's lost 37-15. Capt. Jim Nash led the Niagara Falls team with 18 while Skinner, with 15 and Al Burton with 14, gave shooting support. Farber led the Pioneers with 13 while co-captain Bob Rupp added 12. Both teams shot 36% from the field where DeVeaux had a 25-19 margin in goals. Park was unable to capitalize from the free throw line as they made only 16 of 35, while DeVeaux cashed in 8 of 21.

In a non-league game at Akron on Tuesday, Park was defeated 47-30 as the Pioneers improved on a previous loss by some 20 points but still was unable to put together an effective offense. Co-Captain Dick Appel's hustle and rebounding added to an improved defensive game but few were able to help with points.

Joe Keller led Akron with 15, ably assisted by Al Corbett with 13 and Chet Victor with 10. Only Appel with 11 was in double figures for Park.

SUMMARY: Park shot a low 23% from the field to Akron's 31%.

Pebble Hill of Syracuse will continue CUPS play with a visit next Saturday while Campus School opens Park's home season on Wednesday afternoon.
