Park gridgers drop opener to Limestone

Park School's six-man football team opened the season Saturday and gave a good account of its potential for 3/4 quarters when an alert Limestone high school team broke open with 2 TD's to ice the contest 40-25. Park had threatened on a number of occasions but each time failed to penetrate on crucial yardage and Limestone capitalized.

The lead see-sawed. Rich Appel, co-captain, opened the scoring in the first quarter with a 6 yard sweep. The Limies bounced back with 2 scores as Bob Whiteman found Ray Hatch for a 10 yard pass score and then Steve Saunders with a 23 yarder. The only points in the second quarter came when Appel tossed short to Duane Sevillian for 5 yards and a 15-12 deficit at halftime.

Appel put Park ahead in the third with a 63 yard sweep in which he reversed his field twice to pick up blockers, but Dave Cullen came back with a 26 yard breakaway, and the visitors lead 21-18. As the fourth quarter began, the Pioneers marched to the 27 where Limestone took over on downs and a march was culminated with a 7 yard plunge by Ken Hatch. Appel took the next kickoff 70 yards to bring Park back into contention. But Limestone was not to be denied and after stopping Park drives, they completed the scoring with a 27 yard run by Hatch and another 45 yard race by Dave Cullen to accomplish their second win of the season. It was Park's opener, a non-league affair. Next week Friday they will travel to Pebble Hill of Syracuse to open the CUPS season play.

The Park soccer team continued to prepare for CUPS competition but failed to come up with a win last week. On Tuesday Nichols visited Snyder and in an otherwise even ball game, John Waters scored twice for the winning 2-0 margin. Greg Pauley earned the shutout by stopping all Park threats.

On Friday neighbor Neumann provided another tight contest but went home victorious 2-1. In this case Bob Rupp scored for Park in the opening minutes and this score stood until 12:30 of the final period when Paul Zach creased the nets to tie the game. In the second overtime it was again a breakway for Paul with but 1:30 left and Neumann had its fourth straight win of the year.

Earlier in the week Park traveled to Grand Island and played to a 1-1 tie. Doug Mancini headed the score for Park while John Morrison tied in the 4th period for Grand Island. Two overtime periods failed to break the tie. Park's record was 1 win, 1 tie and two losses thus far. Park is at Williamsville Tuesday and at home for Harley in CUPS play on Friday.

The footballers lost a heart-breaker to Pebble Hill 54-43 for its initial CUPS loss while the hosts gained their third straight win. Again the lead see-sawed as the computers were called in to tally. After a fumble recovery, Pete Ten Eyck opened the PH scoring only to have Park march back and score on a Kim Shoemaker 5 yard run, ending first quarter play. The Pioneers shifted into high gear in the second. A 36 yard pass from co-captain Rich Appel to Dave Mols culminated in another 5 yard sweep by Shoemaker to score. After an exchange of punts, Pete Simmons raced for a TD only to have the play called back for a clipping violation but Park rebounded as Appel raced 43 yards to score. Twin John Ten Eyck interrupted the Snyder surge with a 30 yard pass from Doug Denning. Simmons brought the next kickoff back across midfield and on the second play Dave Mols hit Appel in the clear for a 28 yard score. With less than 1 1/2 minutes to go to half, opportunistic PH scored twice, 2 passes from Denning to Pete Ten Eyck, the latter for 40, gained one score. A fumble recovery after the next kickoff Denning hit John Ten Eyck for 40 and another score and a 27-25 lead at halftime. Park had converted one PAT pass while Pebble Hill had 3.

In the third quarter, Pebble Hill marched with the kickoff as Pete Ten Eyck ran 15 for six. A fumble recovery led to another Pete Ten Eyck dash for 23 and another TD. A long Appel to Simmons pass to the 7 culminated in an Appel sweep to score. But Doug Denning completed the 3rd quarter scoring with a 30 yard dash up the middle.

Never daunted, Appel ran on first down after the kickoff for 49 yards and a score; 2 first downs and then Pete Ten Eyck closed out PH scoring with a 10 yard sweep. A long pass from Appel, good to Duane Sevillian, carried to the 13, and on 4 downs Appel reached the one and was pushed out of bounds to lose the ball. After an interception, Appel rushed for his fifth score and the final of the game, 11 points shy of victory. This ties a Park record of touchdowns per game made by Tom Zierk back in 1953. Park is next at home on Friday against Harley of Rochester.
