

Park sweeps Harley

Conference of Upstate Private Schools play continued with Park hosting Harley School of Rochester and sweeping the day. Soccer continued unbeaten by holding on to a 3-2 margin although Park continued to pepper goalie Craig in the last half unsuccessfully. Co-captain Don Vogel opened the scoring in the first period and was matched by Harley center Time Angle in the second. Before the half, Vogel and Marc Oliver had pushed the Pioneers into their winning scores which stood up in spite of the final Harley goal by Phil Lovell in the third. It was Park's second CUPS win and Harley's first loss.

Earlier in the week, Park had visited Williamsville South and 4th quarter goals by A. J. Block and Willie Karrer enabled the Snyder team to overcome the Billie lead established by a 2nd period goal by Pete Jung. Park has a record of 4 wins, 2 losses and a tie.

The six-man football team finally smashed the win column with a 60-18 triumph over a Harley team which is renewing football after several decades of inactivity. Co-captain Rich Appel returned the opening kickoff 72 yards and added a dropkick PAT for 2 points. Harley marched back with John Gardner scoring on a 2 yard pass from Rick Peck. After the next kickoff, Duane Sevillian broke loose on the first play for 56 yards and a TD. After the second quarter started, Bill

Streuver plunged two for Harleys next score to narrow the deficit to 14-12. However, Kim Shoemaker streaked 33 yards up the middle and Appel added a 70 yard run and another PAT kick to end the half 28-12. In the third quarter Pete Simmons hurdled 1 yard and Dave Mols raced 48 to up the Snyder score while Harley completed its scoring when Mark Mariner caught a 4 yard jump pass from Peck. In the final quarter, Jeff Rochwarger intercepted an errant Harley aerial and went 43 yards to paydirt followed by another Simmons jaunt of 54 yards. Karel Hill completed the day's efforts with a 26 yard jaunt of desire followed by Mols' dropkick.

Park continues its CUPS efforts with a trip to Allendale of Rochester next Friday.

Park Wins Two Events

Park School athletes scored a double in Conference of Upstate Private Schools (CUPS) competition Friday, topping Pebble Hill of Syracuse, 4-0, in soccer and, 53-20, in six-man football.

Don Vogel scored twice in soccer as the host team boosted its record to 5-0 in conference action. Pete Dyett and Mario Santilli each scored and goalie Bob Gilman recorded the shutout as the Syracuseans lost their fifth CUPS game in as many starts.

The Park football team got three-touchdown performances from Dick Appel and Pete Simmons in avenging its only conference setback of the season. Pebble Hill won the first battle, 54-43, in Syracuse.

Appel registered TDs on runs of 60, 31 and 1 yards and passed to Simmons for one of the latter's trio of markers. Simmons also had a 68-yard punt return and a 12-yard run. Kim Shoemaker scored on a 29-yard run for the winners and Dave Mols went 46 yards for a score on a pass interception.

Park soccer unbeaten, gridmen score upset

The Park soccer and football teams gained important wins in the past week. Soccer continued undefeated in Conference of Upstate Private Schools play and at the conclusion of the first round has a 4 and 0 record to lead the league. The Pioneers invaded DeVeaux School of Niagara Falls and returned with a 5-1 triumph. Fred Lyle scored in the first 2 minutes for DeVeaux but then Park retaliated with Rich Ehrenreich tying the match in the first period. Bob Rupp then drove in two goals within a minute and the tide was turned. Co-captain Don Vogel added a goal in the third and Marc Oliver closed out the scoring in the 4th period.

Visiting Allendale School of Rochester, who had been undefeated but tied, Don Vogel creased the nets on the opening drive and scored at 32 seconds. He added 2 more goals in the second period while Bob Rupp completed the scoring for Park offset by a singleton by Tom Ryan. The final score was 4 and 1 and Park now has a 6-2 and 1 tied record.

The football team continued on the comeback trail by upsetting the Allendale six 50-27. The first period saw successful ground games by both teams peter out when the goal came in sight. After a couple exchanges, co-captain Dick Appel almost broke away but did manage to move the ball to the 8 whence Kim Shoemaker bounced thru the middle for the score. Appel took the PAT pass from Dave Mols. Just after the second quarter opening, Allendale drove one, and after three tries, Jim Williams burst across and Charles Donnelly ran the PAT to tie the score. Shoemaker raced 53 yards after the next kickoff and a little later Appel ran in from the 8, with Mols dropkicking both PAT for 2 pointers.

In the third, Appel took a 16 yard pass from Mols and also the PAT pass. Donnelly interrupted

with a 3 yard plunge to bring Allendale to a 30-13 deficit at end of 3rd quarter. Dave Mols caught two 25 yard scoring passes from Mark Cox while Pete Simmons handled a 52 yard scoring pass from Appel to complete the scoring in the 4th period. Jim Williams added 2 scores for Allendale and the final count was 50-27. Park is now 1 and 1 in CUPS play with Allendale 0 and 2. Park is 2 and 2 overall.

Park's only loss came earlier at Pebble Hill and this Friday the two teams take the field again at Snyder with the title at stake. Kickoff time 3:30.

Park met Harley of Rochester and gained a split. The soccer team went down 3-2 for its first CUPS league loss, the exact reversal of the earlier game at Park. The Pioneers now have a 5-1 record with 2 to go while Harley is 4-1-1. Phil Lovell opened the scoring for the home team in the second period while Mario Santilli tied the contest at the half. In the fourth period Harper Sibley and Dave Paddock tallied for Harley while Don Vogel got one back which fell one shy.

On Tuesday Park visited Campus School and gained a 3-0 victory over Campus School. Tom Lewin, Don Vogel and Bob Rupp creased the nets while co-captain Bob Gilman earned his second shutout in a row. Park's overall record was 9-2-1, with an 8-game winning streak now in effect.

After another exchange, Appel raced thru the middle and broke outside for 60 yards and a score. After stopping the next PH advance, Appel outran the visitors 31 yards with his third score of the day and 15th TD of the season to move into a tie for 5th place in the all-time TD parade for Park players.

With reserves accumulating time in the second half, Pebble Hill scored twice when Doug Denning went 50 yards with a punt return and then passed 23 yards to John Ten Eyck for 23.

In the 4th quarter, Pete Simmons added a 12 yard score and Dave Mols raced 58 with an intercepted pass set up when Mark Cox upset the passer. Mols passed to Appel and to Jeff Rochwarger for the PAT's. Pete Ten Eyck ended the day's scoring with a 5 yard pass up the middle from Denning.

Park ran 31 plays for 323 yards and passed for 85 more while limiting the Syracuseans to 87 yards running and 63 yards passing.

Next week Park will travel to Harley or Rochester for CUPS action on Friday.

Park Clinches a Tie For CUPS Soccer Title

Park School's soccer team has clinched a tie for the Conference of Upstate Schools title.

The Pioneers Thursday tied DeVeaux, 2-2, as Bop Rupp and Tom Irwin scored for Park. John Engel and Fred Lyle countered for DeVeaux. Park has a won-6 lost-1 tied-1 record, while DeVeaux is 2-4-1.

Dave Mols took the next kickoff 79 yards for a score and threw the PAT pass to Mark Cox. In the second period a 44-yard TD run by Richard Appel was nullified by a penalty but they came right back and Appel scored from the eleven. Pete Simmons ran for the PAT to take a 21-6 halftime lead.

The second half kickoff was again taken by Park the distance as Simmons raced 25 around end for the score while Appel ran for the PAT. After an exchange of fumbles, Duane Sevillian passed 28 yards to Dave Mols in the clear for a 34-6 lead. Harley came back with Rick Peck throwing 30 yards to Mark Mariner and the same duo meshed for the PAT. After stopping the Rochester drive on their own 34, Paul Farber burst through the line for 46 yards to score. A Harley drive ended with Bill Streuver carrying 15 yards to paydirt and the PAT pass from Peck to Jim Martin was good. Within the last minute Mols broke a couple tackles and raced 45 yards for the final score to make it 46-27.

Park entertains Allendale School of Rochester next Friday at 3 to complete the CUPS season.
