

Park sweeps track CUPS championship

For the past two years Park had hosted the track championships at Snyder, gaining the first sweep in history 2 years ago and successfully defending the SENIOR-JUNIOR division last year. This year the meet moved to Allendale School of Rochester and in the most thrilling contest in history, Park again emerged victorious in the SENIOR-JUNIOR Division and swept the Midget and Cubs age-groups as well. The lead see-sawed throughout the day long meet with first DeVeaux, Allendale and Harley taking short leads and Park enjoying a slim margin at the lunch break. Allendale regained the lead early in the afternoon until with but 4 events to go, including the 2 relays, Park edged ahead and held the margin to the victory. The final tally had Park with 139, Allendale with 129, DeVeaux with 125, Harley with 70 and undermanned Pebble Hill with 8.

In the Senior class, Allendale had 7 winners of the 14 events with sprinter George Amarandos taking the 100, 220 and anchoring his relay win joined by Bill Hurdle the 880 record breaker and long jump champ. Tom Macauley set a pole vault record and added the triple jump win. Only Pete Simmons in the 440 and Bob Rupp in the shot were able to garner Pioneer wins but Simmons added third in the high jump and second in hurdles and anchored the runner-up relay team. Don Vogel had a second in the pole vault at the school record of 11'6" while A.J. Block and Doug Mancini placed in 2 events each.

In the juniors Park won 7 of the 11 events as Duane Sevillian broke the oldest record on the books in the 100, added the long jump and 5th place in high jump and anchored the runner-up relay team. Dave Mols won the 880, the low hurdles, took second in the triple jump and ran on the relay for high points

of the day. Paul Lenzer in the 440, Keovil Burgess in the high jump and Len Hall in the pole vault completed in the 8 point winners for first places. Burgess added a 2nd in the 100. SUMMARY:
