Harley trips Park

Park School travelled to Rochester on Friday and absorbed a 64-41 lacing from Harley School in their new field house, a college-sized court which tested the Park stamina sorely. However, it was the size of the Harley front court trio, Don Tesch at 6'6", and Tim Angle and Mark Mariner at 6'4" each which controlled the boards and opened up the early scoring as the Pioneers of Snyder had a cold hand and dropped 22-4 at the first quarter.

The half ended 31-10 and while the first five went again in the third quarter, substitutions were frequent, but still Park was unable to find the touch. The scoring was more even in the second half and the final margin was achieved with Duane Sevillian's 16 and Jeff Rochwarger's 11 points off the

bench. Harley thus moved into second place in the CUPS league with a 2-1 record while Park dropped to third with a 1-2 record. They return to Rochester next Friday to face Allendale. Sevillian led the rebounders with 11 but Harley had a 40-25 edge. Dave Mols garnered five assists but its 29% field average against the 44% Harley shooting told the story. Nichols shot 36% from the field and both teams hit 55% from the foul stripe.

Hector Todd with 13, Ed Zablocki with 11 and Tim McNamara with 10 hit the double figures for Nichols while Jeff Rochwarger came off the bench to lead the Pioneers and the game high of 14. Nichols jayvees won 50-28 with Dave Comerford totaling 14 for Nichols and Bob Colvin nine for Park.

Sevillian's 42 Is Park Record

Hitting from the corners, outside and a few rebound baskets, 6-foot 2-inch junior Duane Sevillian set a Park School scoring record in Monday's basketball game.

Sevillian hit on 19-of-25 field attempts for 42 points, leading the Pioneers to a 92-77 non-league victory over visiting Campus.

Sevillian's record shattered the 41 point performance of Jim Kreutzer in 1962. Park shot 47 per cent; Campus 43 per cent.

Sevillian nets 42 in Park cage win

Tuesday afternoon Duane Sevillian of Park School set a school basketball record by scoring 42 points in a non-league game against Campus. The Pioneers hit a season high of 92 points to Campus' 77.

Sevillian hit on 19 of 25 shots from the field. The old record of 41 points was held by Jim Kreutza, set back in the 1961-62 season. Park's record is now 7-9.

Calasactius Prep of Buffalo visited Park and was downed 78-52. In a whole-squad effort, the Park seniors plus a couple underclassmen started the first quarter and held a narrow 11-8 lead. In the second quarter, juniors upped the margin to 39-27 led by co-captain Duane Sevillian with 7 of 9 from the field. Duane totalled 24 as well as topping the rebounders with 11. Sophs Pat Sayres and Larry Davis added 14 and 11 points in support as the Pioneers shot 36% from the field and 8 of 14 from the free throw line. John Robson and Mike Calabrese split 32 to lead Calasactius scoring.

Park played host to DeVeaux School of Niagara Falls, undefeated defending champions of the CUPS league but it was a day when the Pioneers rose to their top performance of the

year and emerged winners by a 79-63 margin.

Only a month ago the Rapideers had trounced Park 63-41. But this was a determined, aggressive unit. All five starters contributed buckets for a 22-15 first quarter margin. In the second quarter Duane Sevillian continued to pump from outside along with Jeff Rochwarger from the side and Larry Davis from underneath and the lead rose to 45-28 at halftime. Park had shot a sizzling 57% from the field with 21 of 37 baskets.

In the third quarter Tony Fecker and Al Burton produced DeVeaux scoring with 9 of 11 trials and cut the difference to 62-51 at the third quarter intermission. Once again Park settled down and controlled their offense, moving the ball well and forcing DeVeaux out of its zone, shooting only sure buckets and drawing numerous fouls with Dave Mols and Rochwarger converting while Sevillian and Mols each added two baskets to put the game away for Park's third league win in seven tries while dropping DeVeaux to a 6-1 record, still one game away from its title.

Park Cagers Hit 42% For 4th CUPS' Victory

Dave Mols hit on 8-of-15 field attempts as Park School shot 42 per cent from the field in a 76-54 victory over visiting Allendale of Rochester Friday evening.

The victory closed out Park's Conference of Upstate Private Schools record at won-4 lost-4, 8-9 for the season. Duane Sevillian had 19 points and 13 rebounds for the winners. The box score:

Sevillian had 12 of 18 from the field and the top scoring of 25, his seasonal high, while Rochwarger again came off the bench to muster 17, Mols 15 and Davis 14. Al Burton, league scoring leader managed 21 aided by Fecker's 16 and Jim Nash's 10.

With 33 of 65 for the game, Park shot 51% compared to the visitors 42%. From the foul line, Park was only 13 of 26 while DeVeaux was 11 of 24. Park lost Mols and Davis in the last minute on fouls, but the reserves held up. In the nip and tuck JV game undefeated DeVeaux edged Park 44-40 as Paul Lenzer had 17 and Tim Cochrane
