

## Park splits in cage play

In a non-league game with Calasactius Prep School of Buffalo, Park eased to 60-36 victory. Off to a slow start and held to a 10-10 first quarter, the second platoon took a 22-16 half time lead as co-captain, Doug Mancini had his best day of the year and finished with 11 for high scoring honors. Soph Larry Davis was also in double figures with 10 while Robin Rufus led the visitors with 10. Park managed 25 of 72 for a 34% field mark and had only 10 of 38 from the foul line. The Snyder team is now 4 and 8.

Harley School of Rochester, runner-up team in the CUPS league, had a tussle for 3 1/2 periods on Saturday but then they applied the pressure to gain a 65-47 triumph over the Pioneers. While they managed a 5-10 point lead for most of the contest, the issue remained in doubt as Park spurted on occasion to draw close. Harley had a 26-15 first quarter lead as they caged 10 of 15 jumpers. The halftime score was 36-26 as Park's defense tightened but they were still unable to cash in from the free throw line.

In the third quarter they reduced the margin by another couple points and with four minutes to go, the score was 47-43 but Harley consistently hit on fast breaks to coast to their fourth CUPS win against two defeats. Mark Mariner with 17, Rick Peck with 16 and top rebounder Don Tesch with 13 topped the Harley balance scoring. Harley also repeated the JV win with a 32-25 score altho Paul Lenzner topped all scorers with 18 for Park.

## Park Cagers Clip DeVaux

Park School handed defending champion DeVaux its first Conference of Upstate Private Schools defeat of the season Friday, 79-63, on the winners' court.

Duane Sevillian hit 12 of 18 attempts from the floor, while leading Park (3-4) with 25 points. Jeff Rochwarger added 17, Dave Mols 15 and Larry Davis 14. Rochwarger scored nine, Sevillian eight and Davis six in the second period to account of all of Park's points en route to a 45-28 halftime lead.

## Park ends season

The Campus School of Buffalo visited Snyder and was dropped 92-77 in one of the highest scoring games of the year. Not only was it a Park School team tops for 1970 but co-captain Junior Duane Sevillian broke the Clement Gymnasium record set by Jim Kreutzer back in 1961 with a career-high of 42 points. His remarkable total came on 19 of 25 shots from the field, most of which were jumpers from the corner and outside the key. His 17 led the rebounders and he was also credited with several assists. Park out-rebounded 51-33. Dave Mols with 22 and Larry Davis with 11 aided in the scoring while Eric Copeland topped the Campus shooters with 26 and Wayne Pope was next with 20. Park shot 47% compared to Campus' 43%. Campus was 61% from the foul line as against Park's 50%.

With Mols driving and Sevillian in the corner, the Pioneers jumped to a 21-11 first quarter lead. Sevillian added 6 more jumpers and the margin moved up to 39-24 at halftime. Only Sevillian remained hot in the third quarter as Campus gnawed at the deficit and the score was 56-50 at the end of the third period. The game resolved into a racehorse contest with both teams shooting over 50% and Park outscoring the visitors 36-27 in the 4th quarter alone. Mols with 6, Sevillian with 5 and Copeland with 4 baskets drilled the nets consistently. The Campus Jayvees prevailed 34-14.

Allendale School of Rochester came to Snyder and were defeated 76-54 as Park gained its 4th straight win and completed its CUPS record at 4-4 and its season record at 8-9. After 24 years of CUPS play, Park has won 116 and lost 71. They move up to third place this year.

Baskets by all five starters gave the Pioneers a 19-4 first quarter lead and they were winging to their victory. At halftime the margin was 36-17. The shooting from the field was 42% for Park and 28% for the visitors, while the free throws were 65 and 69% respectively.

Allendale lost three via the foul route but Park, while charged with 20 fouls, lost none. Duke Sevillian had 19 points for Park to total 295 points, fifth highest all-time for the Snyderites. Dave Mols added 18, Jeff Rochwarger 10, and these three juniors lend the nucleus for next year. Senior Marc Feuerstein with 10 along with Doug Mancini with five and Mike Lewin who was scoreless ended their cage careers with this game. Jim Williams dropped in 15 points in the final quarter to lead the Rochester team with 25 points. Park had a 40-20 edge in rebounds and again Sevillian topped all with 13. The Jayvees also won 43-33 as Paul Lenzner had a career high of 23 ably assisted by freshman Mark Karrer with 10.

## 2 From DeVaux, Park's Sevillian On CUPS All-Stars

Al Burton of DeVaux School Conference of Upstate Private Schools scoring champion, heads the 1969-70 CUPS All-Star basketball team.



Burton averaged 20.7 points a game in CUPS play, and 22.1 over-all, as DeVaux won the conference championship for the second straight year.

The six-man All-Star team also includes D. Sevillian of DeVaux, averaging 11.5 in CUPS. Duane Sevillian of Park, scoring runner-up at 17.5, was one of two juniors selected.

The other junior is Dave Paddock of Harley (11.3) while Tim Angle (13.8) and Mark Mariner (12) of Harley round out the team.

Honorable mention includes Dave Mols (10.6) of Park and Nap Andrews (8.7) and Jim Nash (8.7) of DeVaux.
