Park Retains Title

ROCHESTER - Park School of Buffalo won its third straight Conference of Upstate Private Schools championship Saturday at the host Allendale School.

Park, coached by Jim Schum, had 139 points. Next came Allendale with 129, DeVeaux of Niagara Falls 125, Harley of Rochester 70 and Pebble Hill of Syracuse 8.

The meet was held in junior and senior classes with the two combining to determine total points.

Records Tumble

Bill Hurdle of Allendale set a CUPS record with a 2:01.9 clocking in the senior age group 880. Warren Wight, also of Allendale,

a new 120 low hurdle mark of 14 seconds flat, Tom McCauley, a double victor in the triple jump and pole vault hit a CUPS record with a 12-6½ vault. Hurdle doubled with a victory in the long jump and teammate George Amarandos doubled in the dashes.

In the junior age group, Park's Dave Mols won the 880 and 120 low hurdles and teammate Duane Sevillian won the 100 and long jump. Allendale's Jim Williams won the triple jump and shot.

Park Completes Sweep

Park also took the cub and midjet competition. The Park cubs scored 25½, Harley had 14 and Allendale 9½. The Park midjets had 38. Hurley 35, Allendale 35 and Pebble Hill 29.
