Nichols Wins Track Event

Nichols School rung up 59 points Saturday at home to win a five-school invitational track meet. DeVeaux School of Niagara Falls was second with 57 points.

Allendale School of Rochester finished third with 30 points, while Park School had 12 and Harley School of Rochester finished with 4. Fred Hunt of Nichols vaulted 12 feet, 6 3/4 inches to set a school and meet record for the event, bettering his own mark of 12 feet, 3 3/4 inches set last year.

In the two-mile race, Tad Kramarczyk of Nichols set a meet record of 10:52.3. The old mark was 11:04.3.

Baseball, track and tennis on win spree

Park again defeated its CUPS rival from Niagara Falls, DeVeaux School 10-0. Park's record thus stood at 2-1 while DeVeaux's was 2-2. Co-captain Dick Appel pitched the shutout, allowing but two singles, striking out ten and walking but one. The Pioneers took advantage of walks and errors and contributed timely hits with men on bases to garner runs. In the first, Dave Mols singled home the first 2 runs. In the third Dick Lipsitz singled in another while in the third two Pioneers scored safely on dropped balls by the catcher. In the 6th Mark Cox lined a single to left and when the ball went thru left fielder all 4 runs scored.

On Wednesday, league-leading and undefeated Allendale came to Snyder and was stopped 5-1 making its record 5 and 1 while Park climbed to 3 and 1. Allendale had won the season opener in Rochester 3-2. This time Dick Appel pitched a 3-hitter, allowed no walks and struck out 14 as he set down the visitors in order in 5 of the innings. Park broke the ice in the 4th when Dick Comeau singled followed by a liner to left by Appel which skidded by the left fielder and both scored easily. Dick Lipsitz got a life on an error, stole second and scored on Jeff Rochwarger's single. In the fifth, Bob Rupp opened with a double and was singled home by Comeau's third straight hit and he in turn romped home on Appel's double. Park provided errorless support to Appel's third win of the year.

SPLIT D-H

A split with Harley of Rochester on Saturday moved Park into 2nd place in CUPS baseball with a 4-2 record to the visitor's 3 and 3. In the opening 5 inning contest it was all Dick Comeau as he hurled a no-hit, no-run game in his first pitching effort and had Park's 2 hits driving in 2 of the 4 runs. He allowed 2 walks one of which was erased by a sharp double play by shortstop Rich Appel to end the contest. For the second straight time, Park pitching had errorless support.

In the second contest Park was unable to sustain an attack against curve-baller Jon Vaughan who whiffed nine and allowed but 3 hits, 2 by Dave Mols and the other by Mark Cox. Dick Appel was not his sharpest as he struck out 7 but was touched for 6 hits and a 3 to 1 loss. Opportunist Harley scored on a passed ball, overthrow and squeeze bunt to gain their victory.

TRACK

In its second outing of the season, the Park cindermen won over the Rochester CUPS league opponents with a total of 67 points to Allendale's 59 and Harley's 37. Don Vogel set a school record of 11' 1" in the pole vault erasing Bob Wilson's standard set in 1955. Records for the Snyder track were also set by Pete Simmons in the 120 low hurdles lowering Jim Tedesco's mark of 2 years ago while Bill Hurdle of Allendale established a new 880 record of 2:02.3 which bettered his mark of a year ago.
