Park wins & ties in CUPS openers

Park School traveled to Rochester to open its Conference of Upstate Private School athletic activity last Friday, and the football team began defense of its football title with a 45-21 win over Harley School while in soccer the game ended just as the season had ended a year ago, namely both teams tied for the title. This

time it was a 1-1 tie game.

The first half was a standoff and midway in the 3rd period Harley drew first blood as Klaus Gins scored from his wing with an assist to Sherwood. With but 5 minutes left, Mike Lewin evened the score for Park with a drive from the right wing on an assist from John Felgemacher. Park outshot Harley 21 tries to 12 but was unable to penetrate the goal and after two overtimes the game finished even.

Six Returnees For Park's 6-Man Football Opener

Along with 17 11-man football games that open the 1969 Western New York high school season tomorrow, will be one 6-man contest, as Park School of Snyder defends its Conference of Upstate Private Schools championship at Harley of Rochester.

Herb Mols, coaching since 1946, has six returnees from his two-platoon system of 1968. Linebackers are Don Pulli, Marc Feuerstein and Rick Caprow, while backs are his son Dave, Duane Sevillian and Mark Cox.

Dave Mols is the quarterback and top passer, Sevillian provides the outside speed, Cox the inside power. Park has a 24-man squad and plays 11-man football at DeVeaux of Niagara Falls in its final game of the season.

Limestone, the last Section VI school playing 6-man football, is an associate member of the CUPS. The Tigers have just one regular back, Ray Hatch, plus two lettermen in Lenny Livatt and Fred Deemer. Other entries are Allendale of Rochester and Pebble Hill of DeWitt.

Park Defeats Harley, 45-21

ROCHESTER — Dave Mols scored four touchdowns on runs of from 11 to 70 yards Friday as Park School trimmed Harley, 45-21, in six-man football. He also kicked an extra point.

George Yeracaris, Pat Sayres and Marty Downey also made Park TDs, and Duane Sevillian took Mols' pass for an extra point.

Don Tesch counted two touchdowns and Lou Guzzetta one for Harley. Bob Hallenbeck, Bill Struever and Scott Sainsburg got the extra points.

The soccer teams tied, 1-1, Mike Lewin scoring for the visitors and Klaus Gins for Harley.

Park Gridders, Booters Win

Park School scored two Conference of Upstate Private Schools victories over visiting Pebble Hill of Syracuse Saturday.

Park outscored Pebble Hill, 52-33, in a six-man football test, while the host soccer team prevailed, 9-0.

Duane Sevillian and Dave Mols each scored four touchdowns as Park ran its CUPS grid record to 2-0. Larry Melton tallied three times for Pebble Hill in its first start.

Bernd Zimmerman's three goals and Steve Greene's goal-tending led the soccer victory. Park is 1-0-1 in the conference, while Pebble Hill is 0-2.

In football Junior co-captain Dave Mols sparked the Pioneers to their inaugural win. On the second play after the kickoff, Dave burst up the middle for 62 yards and the lead. Harley returned the next kickoff to their own 18, was forced to punt and Park again drove only to have its one and only pass attempt of the day intercepted on the 10 yard line. After a fumble recovery on Harley's 20, the second play saw Mols again sprint through the opposition for 19 yards and then dropkick the PAT for 2 extra points.

In the second stanza a sustained march was climaxed with an 11 yard run by Mols and the first team rested for most of the remainder of the game. George Yeracaris recovered a fumble and rumbled 30 yards for a score as he allowed his blockers to clear the path for him. Soph Pat Sayres took a kickoff with seconds to go for a 60 yard TD as the half ended with Park in front 33-7. Harley scored on a 1 yard pass from Rick Peck to center Lou Guzzetta.

In the second half Park's reserves got a thorough testing with Marty Downey dashing 33 yards for a score and Mols returning for a kickoff in the 4th quarter which he carried 70 yards. Don Tesch, 6'6 end for Harley also returned a kickoff and snared a 20 yard pass from Peck for a second score to make the final tally 45-21.

Park thus takes an early lead in the CUPS race and looked fairly presentable in spite of the loss of junior fullback Mark Cox who suffered an appendectomy Thursday.

Defender Helps Opponent Score

It was Bill Leiker's 17th birthday, so he said he'd score, and with a rather unusual assist, he did.

The Williamsville North soccer fullback put the ball in play on a free kick, booting it 65 yards downfield. A Park School defender tried to head the ball out, and instead headed it into his own goal.

This helped the Spartans to a 4-2 non-league soccer victory Tuesday. Bengt Ljunberg, Bruce Stegner and Steve Jacobson also scored for North, Brewd Zimmerman and Kent Jewett for Park.

Nichols Defeats Park

Dave Scamurra scored twice, once on a penalty kick, in leading Nichols School's 3-1 nonleague soccer victory over visiting Park School Tuesday. John Waters had the other goal for the Big Green while Bernd Zimmerman scored for Park.

Park Gridders remain unbeaten

Park boosters traveled to Williamsville North and lost a 4-2 decision. After a Spartan kick bounced off a Park fullback to open the scoring, the Pioneers lost their drive and although Bernd Zimmerman tied the score, Williamsville carried the game handily. Bengt Ljunberg, Bruce Stegner and Steve Jacobson dropped in goals while Kent Jewett tallied for Park.

The Pioneers outclassed visiting Pebble Hill to gain their first CUPS win 9-0. Bernd Zimmerman booted the first 3 scores while singletons were added by Mark Karrer, Peter Dyett, Kent Jewett, Paul Lenzner and brothers Lewin, Tom and Mike. Their league record is now 1 tie and 1 win.

GRIDDERS WIN, 52-33

The gridgers were led by co-captains Duane Sevillian and Dave Mols as each tallied 4 touchdowns and took the CUPS league lead with 2 wins against no defeats. Sevillian climaxed the first drive with a 28 yard sprint followed by Mols' PAT dropkick. The Syracusans responded with a Brad Denning

to Larry Melton 7 yard toss. This same combination clicked for Pebble Hill in the 3rd and 4th periods, while Denning plunged for 2 other scores.

To retake the lead in the first period, Sevillian took a 16 yard pass in the flat from Mols and the Pioneers were never headed. Mols next dove from the one after a fumble recovery and 3 line plunges set up the score. In the second period Sevillian ran 16 yards around end and after a kickoff was downed on the 7, Mols took the first play for 73 yards and a TD. Sevillian carried 23 yards in the 3rd period and later tossed a screen pass to Mols which covered 42 yards. A pass from Mols to Gary Allen and a return lateral to Mols accounted for the final TD. Sophs Marty Downey and Pat Sayres each added PAT's. They managed the most playing time and accordingly the most tackles as they led the reserves. Mols ran for 148 yards while Sevillian added 137 yards. Next Friday Allendale School of Rochester moves in to Snyder for a 3:30 contest in both football and soccer.

Park gridgers register win

The Park gridgers earned their third straight win of the season over visiting Allendale School of Rochester 26-13 in a come-from behind effort. The omen of what was to come came on the opening play when Park fumbled the kickoff and immediately became defensive. Allendale worked the ball down to Park's 12 but a holding

penalty dropped them back and they were forced to punt. Park likewise moved well across midfield but when threatening, a penalty stopped the drive and again Allendale took over, as the first period ended scoreless. A sensational one hand catch by Duane Sevillian of a Dave Mols pass started Park downfield. Sevillian then carried around end but an apparent score was called back when he was detected out-of-bounds. Two plays later Mols scored from the four. Allendale marched with the next kickoff and Jim Williams tallied from the seven to even the count at halftime.

The third period had been a stalemate as Park passes just missed and at its close Allendale launched another drive with Bill Spalty plunging from the 2 to score and then to take a PAT pass from Jim Bishop and the lead 13-6. Park received the kickoff as the period ended. It took just two plays and with a scoring dash of 56 yards by Duke Sevillian along with a two point PAT dropkick and the Pioneers were back in front 14-13, with seven minutes remaining. After an exchange, Park forced a fumble at midfield and drove to the five from whence Mols tossed a shot pass to center Don Pulli and then received a lateral back to score easily. Once again Allendale fumbled at midfield and on the first play Jeff Rochwarger swept the end 37 yards to a final score and the 26-13 victory. Dave Mols led the tacklers with 8 + 2 assisted while Sevillian ran nine plays for 99 yards. Friday Park travels to Limestone.

Park Defeats Allendale Twice, In Soccer, on Grid

Park School's soccer team scored early for a 3-1 victory over Allendale, but the Pioneers' gridgers had to rally for 20 fourth-quarter points to defeat the Rochester school, 26-13, in Conference of Upstate Schools competition Friday in Snyder.

Bernie Zimmerman tallied two goals and Gordie Ross one for the Pioneers' soccer victory. In six-man football, Duane Sevillian scored on a 56-yard run; Dave Mols and Don Pulli hooked up on a 12-yard TD, lateral play with Mols scoring, and Jeff Rochwarger ran 37 yards for a TD, all in the last quarter. Mols scored earlier on a 4-yard run and kicked a conversion.

PARK SOCCER

The Park soccer team visited Gow School and dropped a 8-1 decision. The South Wales team opened the scoring when Don Hodge scored in the second period. Bernd Zimmerman evened matters just before halftime. However Bud Adams added goals in the 3rd and 4th period to give Gow the win.

In another non-league contest, the Pioneers defeated Campus School of Buffalo 4-1. Bernd Zimmerman scored unassisted in the first period. In the 2nd period, Peter Dyett booted a short kick from the right to make it 2-0 at halftime. In the third period, John Felgemacher drilled a hard shot from the left while Brian Rowe added the final Park tally in the 4th from his right wing position. Scott McCausland scored for the visitors on a head ball from the corner kick to avert the shutout.

Park Champ 3d Year in Row In CUPS Grid

ROCHESTER, Nov. 1 — Park School closed its third straight Conference of Upstate Private Schools championship season in six-man football, and coach Herb Mols has a week to teach his team the 11-man game for their season finale.

Duane Sevillian and Dave Mols scored three times each Friday in a 52-45 victory at Allendale. Mols scored on a 68-yard kickoff return, runs of 15 and 39 yards, and passed 57 yards to Sevillian and 47 to Jeff Rochwarger for touchdowns. Sevillian also ran 31 yards and took a 90-yard pass from Marty Downey.

Park must regroup, with Mols, Downey and Mark Cox coming back from the injury list, for a season-ending 11-man game at undefeated DeVeaux next Saturday. In two previous attempts Park defeated DeVeaux, 7-3, and tied 6-6, both in 11-man.

In soccer, Park lost, 2-1, to Allendale, their first conference loss of the season.
