

Park holds annual Fall awards dinner

The Park School held its annual fall Father & Son get-together on Tuesday evening, Nov. 15, the highlights of which were the letter awards for fall sports. Football awards were presented by Herbert J. Mols, Soccer awards by John Karrer and JV soccer awards by David McKay. The first cross-country honors were presented by James Schum.

John Churchill represented the Yale Assoc. of W.N.Y. which awarded the Park football team the Yale Trophy for the third straight year and for the 11th title in 24 years of the Conference of Upstate Private Schools. Park's league record was 6 and 0. Named to the ALL-CUPS team were co-captains and center Donald Pullie, quarterback David Mols and wingback Duane Sevillian. The latter two are juniors and have been reelected co-captains for next year, along with Jeff Rochwarger.

Honorable mention was accorded senior Douglas Mancini. Mols established two new league records this year as he garnered 20 touchdowns and 134 points for the 6 game season, erasing one record of 17 touchdowns scored in 1948 by Larry Kinner and former Park fullback Ted Nittlerauer who had tied the 17 touchdown output in 1963. Mols' total of 150 points in all 8 games established a new Park School individual total,

topping the 132 point output of Tom Zierk in 1953.

The Buffalo Soccer Club trophy was presented to Coach John Karrer and after 3 straight years in which Park tied for the title, this year they finally won it outright and gained a leg on a brand new edition of this trophy. The ALL-CUPS team included four Pioneers, headed by soph Bernd Zimmerman, who was also the league-leading scorer with 12 goals. Joining him was senior goalie Stephen Greene and backs Christopher Sapp and Kent Jewett. Honorable mention was accorded Gordon Ross, Michael Lewin, Marc Oliver and Brian Rowe. Zimmerman's total moved him into 10th place in the all-time league scoring totals.

Park School visited DeVeaux School of Niagara Falls in a climactic soccer match which was won 4-0 and they thereby won the Buffalo Soccer Club trophy for the year. Co-captain Gordie Ross opened the scoring on a pass from Bernd Zimmerman. Zimmerman drilled the next goal directly.

In the third period Mark Karrer tallied with an assist to Kent Jewett and Mike Lewin completed the scoring for the championship Pioneers who thereby earn the first leg on a new Buffalo soccer trophy for Coach John Karrer. Their record 6 wins, 1 loss & 1 tie.

Park closed their season with a non-league game at Campus

which ended in a scoreless tie. Kevin Kiehl for Campus and Steve Greene and Rog Hedstrom for Park earned the shutouts. Park completed an 8 win, 5 loss and 2 tie season.

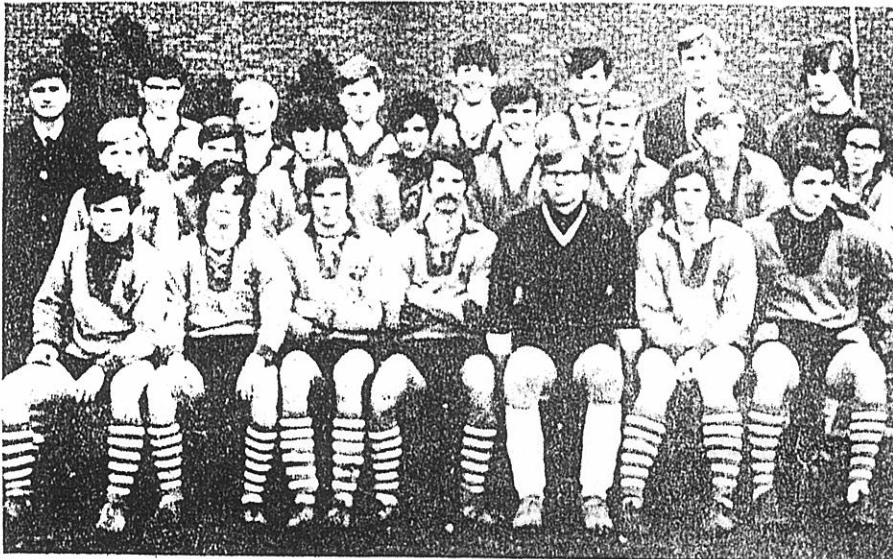
Park's week of conversion to 11 man football was tested and the results were a 57-6 trouncing from undefeated DeVeaux. DeVeaux of Niagara Falls thus avenged a loss of last year with a show of speed and power which overwhelmed the lighter Park forces. Park ended up with a net 23 yards on the ground while losing some 54 yards while attempting to pass.

One of the passes was completed from Dave Mols to Duane Sevillian for 54 yards and this score averted a shutout. Unfortunately, the same duo just missed on 3 other occasions with Sevillian a step in the clear. This was to set the tone for the day.

On the maroon side, Jim Nash opened with a 51 yard run for the first TD while Jim Logan tallied from the 20 to start the first quarter tide. In the second, a march was culminated with a 6 yard pass in the flat from Gary Williams to Al Burton. Next, Tony Fecher ran 18 after an interception and quarterback Gary Williams sneaked over from the one to complete the first half with a 35-0 lead.

Dale White took the second half kickoff 80 yards for a Touchdown and in the final stanza Fecker took the final 7 yards of a 65 yard march. The final score came by Jim Logan from the 10 as time ran out. Logan led the DeVeaux runners with 67 yards while Williams was 3 for 6 and 41 yards with the passing arm. Rick Caprow and Dave Mols had 5 tackles for Park while Mols completed 3 for 11 for 98 yards. Park thus completed its season with 6 wins and 2 losses.
