DeVeaux Trounces Pebble Hill 70-24

DeVeaux School trounced a Pebble Hill of Syracuse 70-24 in the first round game of the DeVeaux Holiday Basketball Tournament, Saturday on the DeVeaux campus. In the other first round game Campus School of Buffalo downed Park School of Snyder 72-61.

The tournament will conclude today with DeVeaux meeting the Campus School at 2:30 p.m. in the championship game and Park School and Pebble Hill playing a consolation game at 1:00 p.m.

DeVeaux raced out to a 20-5 first quarter lead and built the margin to 30 at halftime. Norm Fecker topped the Raider point makers with 12 points while Jim Nash added 11.

Brad Denning paced Pebble Hill with 4 points. Pebble Hill had three players miss the game because of injuries.

Park School led all the way through the first half and held a 36-33 halftime lead before the Campus School exploded for

25-10 third period to build a 58-46 lead.

Charlie Fisher and Eric Copeland topped the winners with 19 and 18 points respectively. Duane Sevillian and Larry Davis split 28 points for the Park School.

The Park Pioneers opened their Conference of Upstate Private Schools basketball season with a loss at Niagara Falls to the defending champion DeVeaux School, 64-43. The teams traded baskets for 6 minutes at the start and the score was tied 8-8 when DeVeaux, led by Al Burton's outside jumpers, went on a 10 point spree to take the first quarter lead of 19-8. Park bounced back in the second quarter with a tighter defense and a bit more success with putting the ball through the hoop but managed to cut the margin by 1 point only. Again in the third quarter Burton and Fecker led the Raiders to the 50-31 insurmountable margin and coasted to their second CUPS win. Sophomore Larry Davis led the Pioneers with 17 points from close and co-captain Duane Sevillian added 9 but topped all rebounders with 11.

Last Friday night Park evened its CUPS season record at 1 and 1 when they topped Pebble Hill of Syracuse 66-61. Duane Sevillian and Larry Davis scored easily in the first period as they dominated the offensive boards and Park had a 16-12 first period margin. The rest of the squad pitched in in the second period to widen the score to 34-20 at halftime.

The second half was a reversal as the Syracusans outthudded and outscored Park. Craig Schultz, who ended up high scorer with 21, and Steve Klimczak threw in short jumpers and were aided by

Brad Denning thru the 4th quarter as they came within 3 points of 46-49 at end of the third quarter. At this point Park tightened its defenses and resumed hitting its big men and the game ended with the 5 point margin as Park controlled the ball in the last couple minutes. Park shot 28 of 64 or 44% from the field for its best day but likewise only shot 44% from the foul strip. Pebble Hill had 33% from the field with 23 of 70 shots and had 15 of 26 from the line. Sevillian and Marc Feuerstein had 9 rebounds apiece while Mols had 4 assists.
