

Park drops pair Park triumphs twice

On Tuesday Park was defeated at Nichols 68-43 as its season record dropped to 6-7. A cold first quarter in which the Pioneers failed to sink a field goal found them trailing 14-3. This set the pattern for the day although Park kept trying to cut into the deficit. Playing without flu-stricken Dave Mols the next setback occurred in the first quarter when Co-captain Duane Sevillian landed heavily and strained an arch which removed him from the lineup for the remainder of the season, so it was reserves who managed the rest of the game. Park shot 31% from the field and were led by co-captain Jeff Rochwarger with 16. For the Green, Eulis, Cathey and Ron Killenger split 30 and shot 36% while controlling the boards at both ends. Park's Jayvees were topped by Mark Karrer's dozen points but they also were downed 52-39.

Dave Mols of Park School and Gary Williams of DeVeaux of Niagara Falls today were the only Western New Yorkers named on the All-Star Basketball team of the Conference of Upstate Private Schools (CUPS).

Rounding out the team were three Rochester players — John Garrett of Allendale and, from undefeated Harley, Donn Tesch and repeater Dave Paddock.

Receiving honorable mention were: Park — Duane Sevillian and Ivan Lockett; DeVeaux — Steve Berlin, Steve Clark and Ross Salisbury. Paddock averaged 18.8 points a game in a 113 total as the leading scorer. Williams was runner-up, with 78. Mols with 70 was fifth.

Rochwarger was high with 14, Davis contributed 13 and Mols 11. Park managed only one bucket as they trailed 19-10 in the first quarter. By the half it had stretched to 42-24 and Harley coasted.
