

# Park School Girl Doubles As Track Champion, Dancer

FROM JUNIOR Olympic championship performances to a dancing role in a Greek play is an extraordinary transition, to be sure.

Yet a 15-year-old, 10th grade Park School student is making this transition thanks to the school's extensive extracurricular program.

She is Debra Sevillian. Last summer Debra won the standing long jump and 100-yard dash titles in the Hamburg phase of the area Junior Olympics program.

Over the weekend she whirled and swirled through a 2½-minute dance routine in Prometheus Bound, a Greek tragedy.

OF COURSE, Debra's athletic ability also keeps her active in the Park School's sports program for girls which includes field hockey, tennis, dancing, skiing, track and field and basketball.

"Debra's transition from sports to the theater is not unusual in our program," the school's athletic director, Herb Mols, says. "We definitely encourage such things in the effort to develop versatile, well-rounded young men and women."

As athletic director, Mols naturally has more than a passing interest in Miss Sevillian's activities. By the same token, Mols' daughter Susan also has more than a passing interest in Miss Sevillian.

SUSAN, a Park School graduate, was the choreographer for the dance routines in Prometheus Bound. Susan wears several Park School hats. She teaches mathematics as well as supervising the dance routines and also coaches girls' track and soccer.

Another Mols, son David, 18, participates in basketball, track and baseball. All in all, there is a definite Mols flavor in the Park School academic and sports programs.

"BECAUSE it is mandatory that all our students, boys and girls, participate in at least one sport, we have aimed at wide diversification in our athletic program," Mols notes.

"In addition to the standards such as soccer, basketball, baseball, football, et al, we also have gymnastics, Junior Olympic wrestling, and other

such sports. With our formal basketball season over, we now move into intra-mural athletics."

MOLS ADDS that the "intra-mural program is designed and produced by the students themselves with, of course, guidance when it is sought. We have found that this benefits the students in many ways. It teaches them organizational techniques, for one thing. It also familiarizes them with the problems to be encountered in running programs of this type."

Mols, now in his 26th year as Park School athletic director, has long been active in Niagara District and National AAU activities. As secretary of the Olympic mens' basketball committee, Mols has been named manager of the U.S.

team that will compete in the Pan-Am games at Cali, Columbia, July 25-Aug. 3.

THE SQUAD, which will report to the U.S. Air Force Academy in Colorado June 6, will be coached by Jim Gudgeon of East Texas State and Johnny Bach, currently of Penn State, formerly of Fordham.

Mols' duties? Arrange transportation schedules, housing facilities, summarize equipment, etc. "Main objective," says Mols, "is to relieve Gudgeon and Bach of all duties except coaching. They'll start with a squad of 66 players and will have to whittle it down to 12. That is a Herculean task, to say the least."

This assignment is old hat for Mols, by the way. He has performed it several times.

Host and defending champion Nichols School won the Big Green's eighth annual invitation track meet Saturday by posting 61 points to best four rivals.
