

# Park gridgers win 3rd straight <sup>10/9/70</sup>

The Park School football team visited Allendale School of Rochester last Friday and finally won out 38-7. The score belies the fact that Allendale took the opening kickoff, tried 4 downs and kicked. On the second play Park fumbled and Allendale recovered on the 26. 5 plays later Jim Williams went 4 yards for Allendale's first and only score. Late in the second period Williams grabbed a long pass but his team was guilty of a back in motion. Otherwise it was all Park in crossing the final line.

Allendale intercepted on Park's next series and moved to midfield whence they punted to Duane Sevillian on the 10 and after reversing his field he went the distance to score. The PAT failed and the Pioneers still trailed 7-6 at the end of the quarter.

Allendale punted and a clipping penalty brought Park back to the 12. On the first play Dave Mols threw the bomb to Sevillian who caught the pass in full flight and went untouched. Mark Cox caught the PAT pass from Mols.

With the second half kickoff coming in a drizzle, Park stayed on the ground but the drive fizzled on the 4. After holding Allendale and forcing them to punt, the Snyder six did not give up until Sevillian had tossed 24 yards to Mols for the TD. On the next kickoff Park again drove the hosts back to the goal line whence a kick came out to the 29. On the third play Mols raced around end for 21 yards and the score.

In the final period, Allendale punted out of bounds to the 34. Mols almost broke free but was stopped at the 14. 2 plays later he reversed his field twice and scored from the 5 with a PAT pass from Mols to Jeff Rochwarger ending the scoring. A brilliant defensive game by linemen Rochwarger, Marty Downey and Pat Sayres who dropped the Allendale quarterback 9 times for considerable losses highlighted the stopping of Allendale. Linebacker and defensive signal caller Mark Cox maneuvered the defenses successfully.

The Pioneers now have a 3 and 0 record and play host to Limestone next Friday at 3:30, the date and time changed as of last week.

# Mols, Sevillian shine in Parks 4th win <sup>10/14/70</sup>

Limestone High School made its annual visit to Snyder on Friday but was buried 55-26 by a surging Park offensive which gained 277 yards on the ground and 233 yards by air, as Park continued undefeated with its fourth win and seventh straight since dropping a close one at Limestone a year ago. Limestone elected to receive after winning the toss but was pinned back to the ten on the first series and the punt was returned by co-captain Dave Mols to the Limey 24. Two plays later Mols faked a line plunge and tossed a short pass to Bob Colvin alone in the right flat. The visitors bounced right back and aided by a face-mask penalty Jim Lucca drove over from the 4. Mols return of the next kickoff was brought back by a clipping penalty to the 19 from whence Mols tossed a bomb to his fleet co-captain Duane Sevillian who went 61 yards for the TD. Again Limestone drove the distance with a 26 yard pass play from Tom Torrey to Lucca scoring, and taking the lead 13-12. After the next kickoff, Mols ran 36 and 3 yards to move Park in front for good. All of this in the first quarter.

Stopping Limestone on the next drive, Mols returned the punt across midfield and Sevillian took off around end for 39 yards and a TD. After the succeeding kickoff, co-captain Jeff Rochwarger raced in to block and catch an attempted pass and was brought down at the 4. On the second play Rochwarger took in a short Mols pass for the score. Bob James spearheaded the Limestone drive with a pass completion and then a 7 yard dive up the middle. Sevillian's pass to Mols got the ball across midfield. Mols then swept to the 4 and then passed to Mark Cox to beat the halftime clock.
