

DeVeaux Captures CUPS Track Title

DeVeaux School needed a victory in the final event — the 880 relay — Saturday to successfully defend its championship in the 25th annual Conference of Upstate Private Schools Track and Field Meet at Park School.

The DeVeaux quartet — Keesvil Burgess, Rick De Gracia, Kurt Lewis and Sandy Graham — led all the way, winning by

five yards in 1:37.2. The triumph earned eight points, while second-place got five, enabling DeVeaux to garner meet laurels, over the hosts, 133½-132½.

Harley and Allendale tied for third with 103 points apiece.

Duane Sevillian and Dave Mols, both of Park, and Sandy Graham of DeVeaux were the meet's double winners.

Sevillian captured the 100 (:10.6) and 220 (:24), while Mols took the triple jump (39-11) and 120 low hurdles (:14.2). Graham's victories were in the 880 (2:03.4) and the long jump (19-2½). Each team had five wins in all.

Park was No. 1 in the midget division with 78 points, followed by Allendale, 23, and Harley, 24. Harley won the cub division with 25. Allendale had 15 and Park 14.

Park edged in CUPS track

The Conference of Upstate Private Schools athletic year was climaxed by the 25th annual Track championships last Saturday at Park. It is 4 age-groupings in 3 meets. The Seniors & Juniors are combined to compete for the Syracuse Alumni trophy. The Middlets, under 14, vie for a separate trophy and Park emerged an easy winner with 78 points to 28 for Allendale and 24 for Harley as they won 6 of the 7 events. Harley's CUPS, under 12 years, repeated with 25 points as Allendale garnered 15 to Park's 14.

But it was the older age groups which provided the closest competition and tension. 25 events comprise the program and the lead alternated between DeVeaux, defending champions, and host Park. 3 times it was tied, most of the time DeVeaux held a slight margin, but then with 3 events to go, Park moved ahead by 9. When Dave Clough won the senior pole vault it cut the margin to 2 and left the entire meeting on the final senior relay. DeVeaux jumped to the lead and held on throughout although Park's final two runners reduced the margin from 15 yards to less than 5 at the wire. With first place worth 8 and second place 5, DeVeaux won with 133½ points to Park 132½.

It was Sandy Graham who anchored DeVeaux and held off Duane Sevillian. He also won the half mile and the long jump, while Sevillian had doubled in the 100 and 220. Sevillian had a 4th in the high jump while Graham was tied for 5th. Dave Mols won the 120 low hurdles in school record time, took the triple jump, third in the mile, and with his relay mates set a school track record. Ivan Lockett and Pat Sayres high jumped 5'8" to set a track record at Park erasing Terry Cheek's mark of 5'6" set back in 1951. In the Junior class, Chip Larkin established a 120 low hurdles mark and anchored the relay record setting foursome with Hedstrom, Colvin and Yercaris. The final record was also by Park in the Midget relay as Lee Klopfer, Allan Thomas, Kirk Herlan and Jim Dare set the 440 shuttle relay mark. TEAM SCORES: Seniors & Juniors —

PLAYERS HONORED
Gordon Smith, athletic director at Allendale School of Rochester, announced the following selections for ALL-CUPS baseball and tennis. In tennis, the decision is based on the results of matches during the season. Park and Harley had tied at 5 and 1 for the season. Harley's No. 1 and No. 2 singles players were undefeated and therefore top ranked, Phil Clark as No. 1 and Pete Yanowitch as No. 2. Tim Beeghly of DeVeaux had the best record at No. 3 singles. The Park doubles teams lost but one match in the whole season and the following teams were top rated — Randy Benderson and Lee Klopfer in the No. 1 doubles and Kent Jewett and Scott Dedecker as the No. 2 doubles.
In baseball, Park ended up in a triple tie with Harley and Allendale with 4-2 season records. The ALL-CUPS selections come from ballots of the team players who select an all-opponent team and the coaches who submit their own appraisal. Park players honored were the senior co-captains and battery of Mark Cox and Dave Mols and outfielder Tim Fitzgerald who is one of the co-captains-elect. Honorable mention went to Jeff Rochwarger and the league batting champion, soph Jim Austin. Cox led the pitchers with a 4-1 record. Fitzgerald topped the sluggers with 2 homers and 8 RBI followed by Mols with 7 RBI and a league leading total of 3 triples. Austin had a .625 average for 5 games with other Park players, Cox, Fitzgerald and Rochwarger at .364, Sayres at .333 and Mols at .300.

Last Friday found the visiting DeVeaux School of Niagara Falls the latest victims of Park's baseball and tennis teams. In CUPS play, Park now has a 3-1 record with the crucial return match with undefeated Harley re-scheduled for next week plus the finale at DeVeaux on Friday. In addition, Park will host a singles tournament on Saturday for CUPS players, 4 from each squad, to begin at 10 a.m. DeVeaux is now 2-3.
