minutes later Lin Hengerer scored another with an assist from Chip Leshner. In the final period, Leshner scored twice in goal mouth melees. Angus Hodge scored twice for Gow.

The Friday game was a seesaw affair with both goalies dominant until Neumann's Frank Grisanti scored on a rebound at 3:58 of the second period. Rich Fredericks handled all of the Park shots to gain his shutout for Neumann. Park's record is now 7 wins, 3 ties and 3 losses.

The football team suffered a 41-0 lacing by Limestone High School to close out a won-4, lost-2 season.

**ROCHESTER** — Park School annexed Conference of Upstate Private Schools titles by scoring a 51-13 football victory over host Allendale and gaining a 1-1 tie in soccer against the same school.

Ivan Lockett scored three touchdowns and Mike Hale tallied twice as Park's gridders climaxed a 4-0 CUPS season. Lockett's TD's came on two passes from Pat Sayres and on a 32-yard pass interception. Hale scored on runs of four and 53 yards.

Gary Vogel's first period goal was equalized by Allendale's Tom Siebert on a fourth quarter penalty kick but the tie after two overtimes gave Park the crown with two wins and two ties. The football summary:
