

Hale Scores 29 Boys, Girls Teams Park Captures 66-56 Decision

The boys varsity routed visiting Allendale School of Rochester, 67-38, to clinch the Cornell Cup, symbolic of the basketball championship in Conference of Upstate Private Schools play. 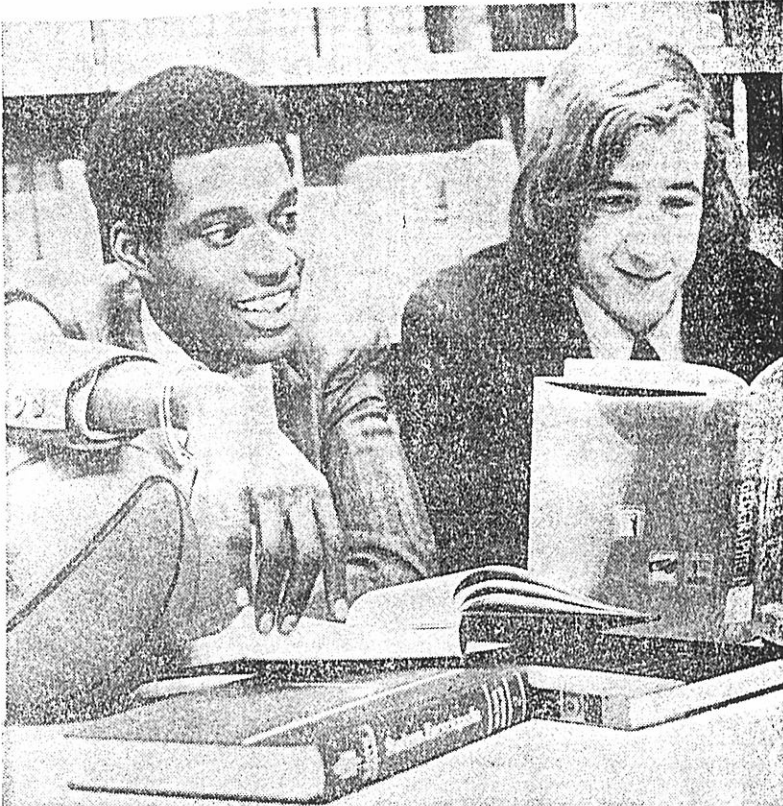
Park Defeats Harley, 39-32
