Park's A Team Skiers Win In Glenwood Acres League

Park School's 'A' Team advanced into the winner's circle this week in the 1972 Glenwood Acres High School League.

Lee Klopfer and Chip Larkin won most of the laurels. Landing the Nos. 1 and 2 spots, respectively, they collected most half of Park's 813 points for the season. Although they came in first in any of four meets, their near-wins added up to 190 and 188 points, respectively.

Rockwell, another Park A'er, won three of the slaloms, but his fall in race No. 3 kept him from a top-10 position.

ORCHARD PARK'S Margaret Ernst flounced the females with a final count of 56 points, 24 points past second-lacer Tina Kolm, skiing for East Aurora.
