

# Swim Meet Plans Are Complete 8/13

## Friday Is Dead Line For Entries - Youth Of Town Invited

Entries for the Town of Amherst Championship Swim began to pour in the past week and it appears that the young people are looking forward to the first meet which will be held in the Park School Outdoor pool, Harlem Road, Snyder, Thursday, Aug. 20, at 6:30 P. M.

The meet is open to all Town of Amherst residents, with events available for both boys and girls in the age brackets of senior (16-18), intermediate (13-15), and junior (12 and under). Besides the freestyle, breaststroke and backstroke events, relays will be contested in all classes. Relay teams should submit their entry blanks either clipped together or with the team listed on a separate sheet of paper. Medals are being awarded for the first three places in individual events and for the first two relay teams.

The deadline for entries is tomorrow, Aug. 14, and any entries post-marked before midnight of that date will be accepted. In the event that too many entries are received for any particular event, it may be necessary to have heats on Wednesday evening, in which case all of the contestants will be notified. Entry blanks are to be found in the AMHERST BEE or by calling Herb Mols, chairman, CI 1651, or the Park School, CI 1242.

Mr. Mols has emphasized that some of the events have a lack of entries, namely, in the back and breast stroke, and that some might find a better chance for placing in these events. The senior events have fallen behind both of the other classes in popularity and he wishes to encourage all residents in this age class to participate.

A special diving exhibition has been scheduled as part of the meet and will include several of the outstanding divers in the area.

AAU officials will be in charge of the meet proper and all swimmers should be at the pool at 6:15 next Thursday in order to start the meet promptly. Guests are invited to attend.

# 107 SWIMMERS VIE IN FIRST AMHERST MEET TOMORROW

Meet Director Herb Mols today announced receipt of 107 entries for the Town of Amherst's first swimming meet in the Park School's outdoor pool tomorrow evening at 6:15 o'clock.

"This is our first attempt to arrange competition among suburban boys and girls," Mols said today. "We are very pleased with the number of entries we received. We hope to make it an annual affair."

Tomorrow evening's competition in the Snyder school tank will include races for three divisions—Junior (12 years and under), Intermediate (13 to 15 years) and Senior (16 to 18 years).

The entry for some events was so heavy that Mols scheduled time trials this afternoon to cut down the starting fields in both boys and girls events. Bob Bedell, Williamsville Central swimming coach, and Tom Tierney, Amherst tank mentor, are assisting Mols in arranging the meet.

In addition to the competitive events there will be a diving exhibition featuring Bedell, Dick Rydberg, former Florida scholastic diving champion now attending the University of Buffalo and Arch Pincombe.

Karl Seidl of Amherst, Section VI 40-year freestyle king, and Bob Hohlstein, 100-yard free star from Amherst, are senior division favorites.

# Swim Meet 8/20 Is Tonight

## 110 Entries Received —Public Invited

Meet Chairman Herbert Mols announced on Monday that 110 entries had been received for the Town of Amherst Championship Swim Meet to be held tonight at 6:15, at the Park School open air pool on Harlem Road, Snyder. Contestants are urged to be ready by 6 P. M.

The number of entries in the Junior Boys and Junior Girls classes required time trials to be held last night at the pool in order to determine the semi-finalists in the 20 yard freestyle events and in the 80 yard relays. The intermediate girls 40 yard free style also held trials to reach the semi-final round of 8 swimmers.

The first order of events tonight will be the semi-finals in all events necessary in order to reduce the field to four for the finals. The top three will receive medals awarded by the Town of Amherst. The top two relay teams will likewise receive medals.

An exhibition diving program will be held with the special contestants including Bob Bedell, WCHS swimming coach, Arch Pincombe, prominent diver and coach at the BAC, and Dick Rydberg, former Florida high school champion and current University of Buffalo diver.

The semi-finals will start promptly at 6:15 and the public is encouraged to attend to support this new venture of the town program. Robert Chalmers, president of the Board at WCHS will be the referee, Bill Sanford, U. of B. swimming coach, will be the starter, and Hanley Staley, swimming coach at Cornell will assist in judging. AAU officials will assist in the conduct of the meet.
