

# Haas, Wilson Lead Assault on Records In Amherst Swim

Bob Haas and Terry Wilson, teammates on the championship Amherst Central School swimming team last season, registered the biggest upsets in Thursday evening's finals of the second annual Town of Amherst swim championships in the Park School pool.

Haas, 18, won the 100-yard freestyle event for senior boys in the record time of :59.7. He scored a narrow victory over Kevin Wilson, a Syracuse University junior, and Karl Seidl, a sophomore at Bowling Green University, who was third. Haas will enter Case Tech in Cleveland next month.

Meanwhile 17-year-old Terry Wilson, who'll be a senior at Amherst Central this Fall, set a record of 1:12.5 in the 100-yard breaststroke, shattering his old mark of 1:13.9. Wilson defeated Don Davis, a sophomore in the U. S. Coast Guard Academy, and Walt Manske, a sophomore at Cornell.

The meet was somewhat of a family affair as members of five families established or helped establish ten of the 19 records. Haas was a member of the 160-yard freestyle relay team while his sister, Sue, was a member of the winning intermediate girls' 160-yard freestyle relay team.

Kevin Wilson, Terry's brother, won the 100-yard backstroke, while Bob Manske swam on the winning 160-yard free-relay team and his sister, Sally, won the junior girls' 40-yard freestyle event.

Sandra Mols, 17, and her 14-year-old sister, Brenda, daughters of Swim Chairman Herb Mols, each were members of record-setting relay teams.

In addition, Brenda tied the 20-yard backstroke record in the junior girls' division and Sandra established a record of :30.6 in the senior girls' 40-yard freestyle.

Hugh and Stu Johnson, twin brothers, each won an event in the junior boys' division. The winners follow:

## Swim Meet Sets Record

### Largest Group Ever Participating in Annual Affair

Before record crowds of over 1,000 spectators, the record-breaking entry of 161 boys and girls participated in the two night 2nd annual Town of Amherst swim meet at the Park School outdoor pool in Snyder, August 25th and 26th. Only three events were able to withstand the record-breaking assault, one was tied, while 25 new marks were established to provide incentive for future meets. Meet Director Herbert Mols was forced to hold 65 time trial and semi-final heats on Wednesday to reduce the field to four for each event for the 29 event program on Thursday night. The competition was so close that the AAU officials were forced into many a huddle to select the winning places. Referee Bill Sanford and Chief Timer Harold Schmidt headed the smooth-working officials while Frank Vogel started the races as quickly as Clerk of Course Roland Murray was able to assemble the swimmers. Announcer Dr. Joe Deluhery kept the spectators well informed on the progress of the meet. The special entertainment provided by Miss Marie Felsler's Aqua-Ettes synchronized swimming exhibition was well received.

Highlights of the meet would include the eyelash victory by Karl Seidl in the Senior 40, the upset win by Bob Haas in the Senior 100 and Terry Wilson's win over Don Davis in the Senior breast stroke. Kevin Wilson out-touched Paul Santmire in the back stroke. Sis Haas, who only last week set a Buffalo Junior Olympic record, was nosed out by Ellen Balvis in the senior girls 40 backstroke, while Sue Anderson beat out Carol Lock in the free style, both in record time.

All of the representatives of the winning Snyder team and the fourth place Williamsville team in Buffalo meet were prominent in the results. Hugh Johnson and Stu Johnson moved up a class and continued their winning ways of a year ago. Diane Newman and Richard Lohr gained the midget sprint laurels. Terry Thompson defended his midget breast stroke title, while the girls' midget relay team of Clark, Cleary, Marcille and Whaley edged out last year's champions. The midget and junior boys teams repeated their victories of the Buffalo meet as DeKleine, Miller, Frauenheim and Gourlay, and Apa, Greil, Abercrombie and Wutz gained wins in the finals. The intermediate boys and girls teams added substitutes who also gained wins, namely, DeKleine, Cree, Campbell and Johnson and Haas, Lock, Mols and Randall.
