

Swim Entries Close Tomorrow

Town Championships Will Be Held at Park School August 18

Tomorrow will be the last day for entries to be made out and delivered to Herbert J. Mols, director of the Town of Amherst Swimming Championships. This is the third annual meet to be held at the Park School outdoor pool under the joint sponsorship of the Town of Amherst, the Park School and various service organizations of Amherst who contribute special trophies for the senior class event.

The meet is designed to encourage any and all boy and girl swimmers to find an event in which they can compete and has become an example of a successful program for all towns of Erie County. Trials and semi-finals will be held at Park next Thursday evening starting at 6:00 P. M. while the finals will be held the following evening. Events are listed for the midget, junior, intermediate and senior open classes, according to age. In all, there are 19 races for boys and 11 for girls.

The Jaycees sponsor the 40-yard dash for men, the Bachelor Arms 100-yard free style, the Lions 100 yard backstroke, Lamm Post 100 yard breast stroke, Exchange 160 yard individual medley, the Kiwanis the 120-yard medley relay and the Rotary the 160-yard free style relay. In addition, the Williamsville Lions and the VFW Post have contributed to join in the above program which is reaching all of the youth of the Town.

Amherst Team Set For Jr. Olympics at Kensington Pool

On Saturday, August 13, at 2 P. M. in the Kensington pool in Buffalo, the Town of Amherst swimmers will attempt to win the Junior Olympic banner of Erie County again. Winners in the first meet in which they entered last year, the Town team will be fully represented again in the attempt to defend their championship against a bigger field.

Herbert J. Mols, chairman of the Town meet, along with Robert Bedell and Thomas Tierney, conducted time trials to select these representatives in the 4 age classes for both boys and girls, namely 10 and under, 11-12, 13-14 and 15-16. Several of last year's competitors are back again bolstered by newcomers and those of the new 10 and under class.

Seidl, Haas Win Two Events In Amherst Swimming Meet

Karl Seidl and Bob Haas each won two senior boys' individual events and then teamed to help win a relay race last night in the third annual Town of Amherst swimming meet in the Park School pool.

Seidl set records in his individual wins, stroking the 100-yard

breaststroke in 1:06.4 and the 160-yard individual medley in 1:58.6.

Haas set one standard with a :57.2 effort in the 100-yard freestyle. He also captured the 40-yard free with a :20.7 clocking.

Haas and Seidl then teamed with Paul Santmire to score in the 120-yard medley relay. Their time was 1:06.4.

Nine Records Set, Two by Karl Seidl, In Amherst Swim

Nine records were set—six in the boys' division and three in the girls—Friday evening in the Town of Amherst's third annual swimming championships in Park School's outdoor pool.

Karl Seidl, who'll be a junior at Bowling Green University next month, set a record of 1:06.4 in winning the 100-yard breaststroke event and established a mark of 1:58.6 in the 160-yard individual medley. Seidl then teamed with Bob Haas and Paul Santmire to win the 120 medley relay in 1:06.4.

Haas, also a former Amherst Central School star, set a record of :57.2 in the 100-yard freestyle event and won the 40-yard race in :20.7. Santmire won the 100-yard backstroke race in 1:11.8.

Gary Mols, 9-year-old son of Meet Director Herb Mols, set a record of 14.2 in the Pee-wee boys' 20-yard freestyle event. Mols' daughter, Brenda, won the intermediate 40-yard breaststroke in :39.8. The winners follow:
