FOURTH ANNUAL AMHERST SWIM CHAMPIONSHIPS AUG. 16-17
Junior Olympic Trials July 23

The Town of Amherst will again sponsor a championship swim meet for all residents of the Town of Amherst and Village of Williamsville, to be held in the outdoor pool of Park School, Snyder, Thursday and Friday, August 16 and 17. Meet Director Herbert J. Mols has completed preliminary plans with his committees and they are again ready for another record-breaking attendance and performance.

Robert Bedell, village recreation director, has accepted responsibility for organizing the Town of Amherst entries for the Erie County Junior Olympic swimming championships, which occur prior to the Town championships. Permission has been received to hold the trials in the new Amherst Junior High School pool on Monday, July 23, at 2:30 p. m. Winners will be determined in four age-groups of ten and under, 11 and 12, 13 and 14, and 15 and 16. These winners will then represent the Town in the Erie County championships at Orchard Park on Saturday, August 4. The final meet, bringing together the first three of the County versus the first three of the City, will be held at Kensington pool on August 11. Two years ago, Snyder-Eggertsville won the team championship and paved the way for entry of suburban teams into the Junior Olympic program, which is a nation-wide program in which winning times are telegraphed to AAU headquarters in New York, and compared to determine national champions. Last year the suburban team gained its first victory over the City of Buffalo cousins.

The service clubs of the Town are again pitching into the Town program by helping to sponsor additional events. Eggertsville-Snyder Rotary, Kiwanis, Bachelor Arms, Quota, Exchange, Junior Chamber of Commerce, Lamm Post, V. F. W. No. 416, and the Lions of Amherst, and of Williamsville are all behind this youth recreation program.

The championship swim program has been slightly revised so that it is in line with the national AAU age-group swimming program and that noteworthy performances can be forwarded for recognition. The new "Pee-Wee" class of last year has more events added in recognition of their intense interest of a year ago. The senior class will again be "open" so that the best of talent in Amherst, including high school and college champions, can show their wares.

Junior Olympic Trial Events Listed
