Fourth Annual Event to Be Held August 16 and 17; Entries Now Being Received 7/0 6

The fourth annual Town of Amherst championships have been overhauled again in preparation for the swim meet to be held at the Park School outdoor pool, August 16 and 17. The new PeeWee class for those 10 and under, has been added due to the number of entries a year ago. Four events for the boys and two for the girls will be contested, so that our youngest swimmers will get started by competing against those of their own age. In addition, the next three classes have been brought into the age line of the national age-group swimming program of the AAU, which permits all worthy times to be registered and compared with those throughout the country.

Sandra Francis of Snyder and Dave Cullis of Williamsville are the first competitors to file entries for this increasingly popular venture of the Town's summer recreation program. Dave took the third place medal in last year's 40-yard freestyle, while Sandra just missed. out in the semi-finals.

The intermediate class has added. two new events, the 100-yard free-style, and the 60-yard individual medley, to provide more opportunity for the versatile swimmer, and to encourage more competition in the events other than the freestyle. It has been found each year that the freestyle naturally receives the most entries, but each boy and girl, who has any potential ability along the lines of the backstroke or the breaststroke, should be encouraged to try out and work on these events.

The original applications, printed in last week's AMHERST BEE had need of two corrections, which have been made in this weeks entry olank which may be found on an-other page in the BEE. The Midget Bachelor Arms boys relay should have been 160-yards instead of 80-yards, and the 100-yard freestyle was omitted from the Intermediate Boys class, and is herewith added.

Entries must be received by Meet Director Herbert J. Mols by August 10.
