Eight Records Broken In Amherst Swim Meet

Eight records were shattered and one was tied in last night's 39 race fourth annual Town of Amherst swimming meet held at the Park School pool.

One boy and one girl were the only competitors to emerge from the record field as double winners. Lynn Hemink, who is better known for his achievements as a Williamsville High School football, basketball and baseball player, won the intermediate boys' 100 yard backstroke and 60 yard individual events.

The young lady to taste victory twice was Brenda Moles, 16 year-old daughter of Herb Mols, meet director. Brenda copped the intermediate girls' 49 yard breast and backstroke races. She also anchored the winning 160 yard relay team.

Joining Brenda in last night's competition were younger brother and sister Gary and Susan. Gary, aged 10, was a member of the winning boys' pee wee relay, while Susan took a third in the pee wee 20 yard breast stroke. she's eight.

Despite all the record-breaking in the younger classes, most creditable time of the evening was turned in by Ray Johnson, Amherst Central High School's star swimming senior. Johnson was clocked in :20.6 for the 40 yard free for senior boys. He also anchored the senior boys' record-mashing relay team which included Bob Manske, Ned Glenn and Bill De Kleine. The quartet splashed the 160 yard distance in 1:24.8.

Last night's first and second place winners will compete in the Wednesday, August 29 meet at the Lincoln Park pool in Tonawanda, in which are also entered all star teams from Tonawanda — Kenmore and North Tonawanda.

BUFFALONIANS WIN IN 2 DIVISIONS OF CHAUTAUQUA SWIM

CHAUTAQUA, Aug. 27—Two Buffalo swimmers Sunday were victors in two divisions of the 1 1/4-mile cross-lake swim held in choppy waters on Chautauqua Lake.

Dr. Milford Maloney was victorious in the Men's Division as he covered the distance in 27 minutes 11 second. Walter Mahoney triumphed in the Boys Division (13-14 years) in 31:10.

Two Pittsburgh brothers also were winners, one of them setting a new lake record for the distance. Fifteen-year-old Tom Lindsey, in the 15-16-year-old Division, lowered the old record by more than half a minute with a 26:22 effort. Brother John, 12, was clocked in 32:51 in his class.

Carol Fetzor of Bemus Point won the Women's competition in 34:24, the same time taken by Linda Poole, 16, of Mt. Lebanon, Pa., in the Girls 15-16-year class. In the 13-14-year Division, Patty Feehan of Allison Park, Pa., was first in 30:51, and in the Under-12 group, Sandra Lee Burry of New Wilmington, Pa., was timed in 29:16.
