

# Amherst Championship Swim Meet Is Set For Thurs., & Fri., Aug. 14-15

Annual Meet Is Open To All Residents Of Town — Entry Applications Must Be Filed By August 3 — All Events Are Listed

The Town of Amherst again sponsors the championship swim meet for all the residents of the town, to be held in the outdoor pool at the Park School, Harlem Rd., north of Main St., August 14 and 15. Recreation Director Arthur Kobus and Summer Director Jan Wittlinger have earmarked this event as the climax to the summer swimming season, inasmuch as the winners of this meet will be selected to represent Amherst-Williamsville in the quadrangular meet with Kenmore-Town of Tonawanda, City of Tonawanda and City of North Tonawanda the following week.

In addition to Town medals, the service clubs have again pitched in to sponsor certain events with special trophies, the clubs including the Snyder-Eggertsville Rotary Club, Amherst Kiwanis, Bachelor Arms, Williamsville, Amherst Lions, Lamm Post, V.F.W. No. 416, Junior Chamber of Commerce, Quota Club, K. of C. and Amherst Shrine Club.

The meet is conducted under the sanction of the A. A. U. and the classes are set up in conformity with the national Age-group set-

up. In addition the Senior or "unlimited" class is offered so that all ages are included.

The entry list for this meet has increased annually so that it was necessary to set aside two days several years ago. The preliminaries are designed to reduce the field to the fastest four in each event. In some cases, it is necessary to have semi-final heats on Thursday, so that Friday will be an all-finals affair.

## Amherst Swim Trials Tonight

Championship Finals Tomorrow Night At Park School

Over 150 swimmers will be competing in the sixth annual Town of Amherst Swim Championships tonight and tomorrow at the Park School outdoor pool on Harlem Road, between Main St. and Sheridan Drive. Trials and finals start at 6 p. m. sharp.

In all events in which more than four swimmers signed up, there will be time trials tonight in order to reduce the field to the fastest four. No time trials will be necessary for those events in which less than four applied. Meet Director Herbert J. Mols held open certain events in which the minimum number had not been filled, especially the Senior Boys' and Girls' events. If applications have not been received, the events will be scratched.

Swimmers will be competing for the Town of Amherst championship medals and for the special trophies awarded by the following service clubs: Eggertsville-Snyder Rotary, Kiwanis, Bachelor Arms, Williamsville Lions, Lamm Post, V.F.W. No. 416, Amherst Lions, Quota, Junior Chamber of Commerce, Shrine, and Knights of Columbus.

The meet is a part of the National A.A.U. age-group swimming program and is sanctioned by the Niagara District of the A.A.U., with qualified officials assigned to the meet.

Winners in this meet will also qualify to represent the town in the annual triangular meet with the Tonawandas at the Lincoln Pool, either the 27th or 28th of August. Mr. Bedell and Mr. Mols reserve the right to make alterations for the good of the team and in order to fill in all of the events selected.

## Don Keel Triples in Swim Meet

A triple victory by Don Keel and 12 record performances highlighted the sixth annual Town of Amherst swimming championships last night in the Park School tank.

Keel, competing in the division for senior boys (17 and older), equaled the 40-yard freestyle record of :20.5, then returned to win the 100 free in 1:00.7 and the 100 breaststroke in 1:24.6.

Three swimmers—Susan Mols, Pete Kerber and Dick Haas—each had a hand in two record efforts.

Susan set a mark of :21.2 in the 20-yard breaststroke for girls 10 and under, then swam the third leg of the 80-yard relay team which turned in a record 1:04.2 clocking.

Susan's relay teammates

were Marilyn Dumke, Sharon Sanders and Barbara Jacobi.

Kerber set a record of :23.6 in the 40 free for boys 11-12, and swam the first leg of the 160 relay team which was timed in a record 1:46.6.

Kerber's relay teammates were Larry Robinson, Gary Mols and Jim Moore.

Haas, swimming in the division for boys 13-14, did a record :29.8 in the 40 breast, then teamed with Joe Chimera, Craig Bruehl and Frank Moore to set a 1:35.8 mark in the 160 free relay.

## DON KEEL WINS THREE EVENTS IN AMHERST SWIM

Don Keel's triple victory, double wins by Susan Mols, Steve Cochrane, Dale Neuberger, Dick Haas and Pete Kerber, plus 12 records marked Friday evening's sixth annual Town of Amherst Swimming Championships in the Park School pool.

Keel won the senior boys' 40-yard freestyle in the record time of 20.5 seconds. He also won the 100-free in 1:00.7 and the 100-yard breaststroke in 1:25.6.

Little Miss Mols highlighted a family effort. Susan won the 20-yard backstroke for girls 10 years and under in the record time of :21.2, then helped Marilyn Dumke, Sharon Sanders, and Barbara Jacobi to an 80-yard relay mark of 1:04.2. Sandra's brother, Gary, won the 11-12-year boys' 20-yard backstroke in :15, while her sister, Brenda, took the senior girls' 40-free-style in :30.5.

Haas and Kerber also were in individual and relay records.
