11 Records Go in Swim At Amherst

Six boys' and five girls' records were broken in the eighth annual Town of Amherst swimming championships at the Park School.

Dale Neuberger was clocked in :13.2 in the 20-yard backstroke for boys 10 and under. Neuberger then teamed up with John Corbett, Charles Steffens and James Grass to set an 80-yard relay standard of :50.4.

In the 11 and 12-year old competition, Vern Syverson set a mark of :13.3 for the 20-yard backstroke, and Jim Moore created a record for 13 and 14-year olds in the 40 yard freestyle. Moore's time was :21.7.

Two records were established for 15 and 16-year old boys. Craig Bruehl turned in a 40 yard freestyle performance of :20.6, and Jim Riley, Joe Chimera and Tom Frauenheim won the 80-yard medley in 1:00.2.

Nancy Zaepfel set a 20-yard backstroke mark of :14.4 for girls 11 and 12 years old. A 40 yard backstroke standard of :31.1 was set by Beverly Dumke for girls 15 and 16 years of age.

Three marks for girls 13 and 14 years of age were recorded. 40-yard freestyle, Chris Lucas, :23.3; 40-yard backstroke, Debbie Ballinger, :30.1; 40-yard breaststroke, Ginny Murray, :37.6.

Besides the fact that 18 records were smashed, the meet was conducted in a manner of which all residents could be proud. The events were run very smoothly and on time, the pool was in top shape and the spectators had a good vantage point. So many times these three points are sadly neglected.

The man responsible for the success is Herb Mols, the meet director. His enthusiasm over the years has not waned and as a result, the meet has become one of the highlights of the local summer season. Many of the district high schools will see the results when they start winning swimming championships.

Another contributing factor to the success was the speed in which the officials tabulated the results after each race. This often becomes a lengthy process and can slow down the whole affair. Over 40 events were run in a period of two and a half hours. After 18 records were set by the participants, maybe the two and a half hours is the 19th.
